Happy New Year! I've mentioned the various spellings of the Sears name in the past, Soares (Portugues), Cyr (French), Zaher (German), Sayers, Sear (English) and I continue to hear about the family name in other parts of the world. There is quite a contingent in Australia, surely due to the English influence. Many Provincetown, Massachusetts Sears seem to be descended from the Portugues Soares fishing families. I have compiled a list of people later in the newsletter who have first name or middle name Sears just so we can see how well the name is carried forward even in the distaff lines. My quest for more people with the "Christian" or Given name **Sears** continued with a famous astronomer, Prof. **Sears Cook Walker** (1805-1853). It must be interesting to be stuck with three Surnames. Cook is alternately spelled with the New England "Cooke" variation. Hoping that he was another of our famous ancestors I was able to track down some convincing information at [www.familysearch.org](http://www.familysearch.org). While not genealogical proof, this does give us an interesting provenance for the name. It seems his mother was Susannah Cooke and her father was Sears Cooke. Sears Cooke was named after his grandmother, Elizabeth Sears (1680-1724), wife of John Cooke. More details follow in the newsletter. Please contact me if you would like more information about anyone you find in the newsletter.

This volume is the thirteenth of the series which was begun in 1852 by the publication of the Ephemeris for 1855. These publications were authorized by act of Congress in 1849, and the work was placed in charge of Admiral (then Lieutenant) C. II. Davis. With that zeal in the cause of science for which many officers of the United States Navy have been distinguished, Admiral Davis undertook the difficult task of giving the materials and form of this work such a value as should not only adapt it to the needs of the Navy, hitherto dependent on a foreign country for so important a part of its equipment, but should adapt the work also to the scientific wants of the country, and make it worthy to take the place of the British Nautical Almanac in our geographical surveys and in the numerous observatories which have been established in

this country. By the aid of our most skilful astronomers, and especially through the co-operation of Professor Peirce and Mr. Sears C. Walker, the more serious difficulties were surmounted ; fundamental tables were prepared from the best determined astronomical data, and a corps of computers was trained for the work.

Walker, Sears Cook (28 Mar. 1805-30 Jan. 1853), astronomer, was born in Wilmington, Massachusetts, the son of Benjamin Walker and Susanna Cook, farmers. He graduated from Harvard in 1825. While there he developed two great loves. The first was languages; he eventually learned to read at least seven, including French and German. The other was astronomy.

Peter Sears[3770](1743-1802) and his nephew Lieut Peter Sears[6133](1787-1867). The library was gracious enough to microfilm the papers and loan me the film. New state-of-the-art research facilities now stand on the site at the University of Missouri-Columbia where an Agricultural Research Service scientist and his wife worked side-by-side for more than 40 years. The Ernie R. and Lotti M.S. Sears Plant Growth Facility, on the university's central campus, will be formally dedicated May 21.

ARS and university researchers are continuing their cooperative research in the new facility, which features growth chambers, 12 state-of-the-art greenhouses, and cold storage for seeds, seed drying and shelling.

Where the new complex stands and where the Sears' Greenhouse Number 10 once stood, ARS cytogeneticist Ernest R. Sears--in the 1950s--transferred a gene for resistance to leaf rust disease from a wild grass species into the wheat variety Chinese Spring. That feat led to rust-resistant wheats around the world and increased

annual revenue for the wheat farmers of Kansas alone by an estimated \$30 million.

It was science's first example of chromosome engineering, incorporating a small segment of a chromosome from one plant species into another. This is one of many contributions that Sears and his wife Lotti made to science.

After obtaining his Ph.D. from Harvard University in 1936, Ernest worked for ARS at the University of Missouri until the day he died in 1991. He and Lotti, also a highly respected cytogeneticist, produced a series of wheat lines called aneuploids that they used to analyze individual chromosomes for useful genes.

In similar research, Lotti and graduate student Suzanne Lee-Chen helped initiate genetic mapping research of the plant Arabidopsis. Attending the dedication ceremony on May 21 will be Sears family members, keynote speaker and Nobel Laureate Norman Borlaug and other notables who worked with Ernest and Lotti Sears. Ernest Sears was among the first inductees in the ARS Hall of Fame. He also received other prestigious awards including the Hoblitzelle Award for Research in Agricultural Sciences and the Wolf Prize in Agriculture.

ARS is the U.S. Department of Agriculture's chief scientific research agency.

Ernie and Lotti Sears Plant Growth Facility contains 12 greenhouses, walk-in growth chambers, a state-of-the-art tissue culture and transformation laboratory and long-term seed storage rooms for the preservation of genetic resources. This new facility is an optimum working environment for carrying out the daily activities of plant science research.

On the site of this new structure stood other greenhouses, the working environment of our predecessors, geneticists and plant scientists of the 20th century. Ernest R. Sears (1910-1991) and Lotti M. Steinitz-Sears (1916-1995), known to us as Ernie and Lotti, were among the outstanding USDA-ARS and University of Missouri-Columbia researchers who made substantial and unique contributions to plant genetics. Working together, they created an environment of lively industry and fellowship that encouraged international exchange and brought international recognition to MU. It is fitting that the new central campus greenhouses will be named for two working scientists who dedicated their lives to learning and to toil on this very place in the original Greenhouse number 10.

The naming of this facility for Ernie and Lotti Sears honors not only their lives and legacy, but also their teachers, their colleagues and students, their family and friends, and future generations of MU's plant research community.

### Dedication

Greenhouse 10, which stood at the University of Missouri-Columbia for 100 years, was a hub of international science.

In Greenhouse 10, Professor Ernie Sears transferred a gene for resistance to the fungal disease called leaf rust



from a wild relative into the wheat variety Chinese Spring. His work was the first example of planned genetic engineering.

This contribution alone placed him in the pantheon of great scientists, but it was only one of the many contributions he made to science.

Ernie Sears identified the wild grass species that hybridized with macaroni wheat to give rise to bread wheat, upon which the world depends. He created a unique and complete set of aneuploids unmatched in any other species. He used them to locate genes to chromosomes, and to unequivocally demonstrate not only the evolution of bread wheat but also the similarities between the individual chromosomes of its parental species. This theoretical contribution applies to many other plant species, both cultivated and wild. He showed that the regular chromosome pairing in polyploid wheat is under genetic control. These discoveries are the foundation upon which the genetics of allopolyploid plants are fully comprehended.

Ernie Sears didn't just develop concepts and theoretical frameworks - he sowed the seed, watered and tended the plants, made the hybrids, and analyzed the results himself. He was the epitome of a frugal and practical scientist. In five decades of work, with little more than a pair of forceps and a microscope, he made Greenhouse 10, the College of Agriculture, and the University of Missouri a Mecca to which scientists from all over the world flocked.

Professor Sears is remembered as a gentleman of unsurpassed modesty, a colleague of unequalled generosity, and a beacon of theoretical enlightenment and practical consequence. He was a member of the National Academy of Sciences, President of the Genetics Society of America, and a member of other learned societies. He was a recipient of many awards, including the Wolf Prize in Agriculture and the Hoblitzelle Award for Research in Agricultural Sciences.

We all shine in his reflected glory.

Ernie

On Oct. 15, 1910, Ernest R. Sears was born on the family farm near the town of Bethel in the Willamette Valley of western Oregon. The 140-acre farm was typical of the area: a dairy herd of 15 to 20 registered Jersey cows, plus one Jersey bull, on rolling pasture bordered by oak woodlands.

Ernie's father Jake did not own a tractor and the farming was done entirely with horses. Much of the cultivated acreage was used to grow hay to feed the cows in winter. The rest was sown to wheat and oats. Supplementing the modest income from the dairy was a flock of chickens raised to barter eggs for groceries, a few turkeys, a small fruit and filbert orchard and a kitchen garden to supply the family dining table.

Learning and teaching were traditional values in the Sears family, as integral to daily life as farm chores. Ernie's father served for years on the local school boards, and his grandfather, Perlonzo "Bud" Sears, was one of the first schoolteachers in rural Oregon in the early years of statehood.

"I attended rural Bethel School, where each of the three teachers had four grades in one room," Ernie recalled later. "My high school graduating class of five was the largest in several years. After school, I helped my father with milking and other chores, and summers I assisted with the farming or bicycled a few miles to harvest strawberries, cherries, string beans, pears, plums or hops."

Ernie's aunt was also his seventh-grade teacher. Her son, Charles Sears, remembers Ernie as among his mother's favorite pupils.

"She really admired Ernest because he was so smart, such a hard worker, so polite and respectful and had a good sense of humor. Everybody liked him."

"The boys went to school barefoot except in the coldest winter weather," Charles recalls. "In those days, they cut across the fields instead of going around by the road, so it was about a mile walk."

Besides being a top student, Ernie was also involved with 4-H, which acquainted him with Oregon State College (now University) in Corvallis, where he enrolled as an undergraduate. "Chemistry, with which I had had no previous contact, fascinated me," he later wrote, "but I elected to major in the Farm Crops Department."

He continued to work in the fields during summer, picking hops for about \$3 a day. "He worked the harvests to earn money to pay his college expenses," cousin Charles remembers. "I do recall when he was picking hops, around 1929, he would walk over two miles to the highway at about 4 a.m., where the truck would pick him up and take him 20 miles to the hopyards, then bring him back in the evening and drop him off."

Ernie's thoughtfulness made a clear impression on his younger relatives. Charles said. "We little kids didn't know what hops were, so one day Ernie brought back a hop vine and hung it on our mailbox for us on his way home."

Ernie excelled in his studies at Oregon State and participated avidly in college life, joining a variety of agricultural clubs and serving as president of several. He honed his writing skills as night editor at the student newspaper. He graduated with straight A's, receiving All College Honors and winning a scholarship to Harvard University graduate school.

In 1932, he entered Harvard to study genetics under Edward Murray East, an early pioneer of plant genetics who taught at the school's legendary Bussey Institution of Applied Biology. Karl Sax, another East student and

later, faculty member, described the Bussey Institution's unique relationship to the Harvard community.

"The Bussey income was always meager; the farm was used to board cattle and horses to supplement the income, and vegetables were grown and then sold to the Harvard University dining halls. Students paid for their tuition by working on the farm and cutting wood that was sold to the professors in Cambridge." Ernie helped pay his way by caring for Professor William Castles' guinea pigs.

Upon earning his Ph.D. in 1936, Ernie immediately accepted a USDA position at the University of Missouri-Columbia. He traveled there by train and bus, walking the last few miles into town after the bus broke down. He remained at MU for the rest of his life.

Lotti

Lotti Maria Steinitz was born on May 2, 1916, in Berlin, Germany. At that time, Europe was embroiled in World

War I. Germany was fighting England and France in the west and Russia in the east. Lotti's father, Dr. Ernst Steinitz, was stationed at the eastern front. The following year, as Lotti's sister, Ilse Berg recalls, Dr. Steinitz was appointed to a base hospital in the northwest German town of Hannover, and the family settled there.

Their new apartment was spacious and airy, with a view of the opera house across the tree lined boulevard. It was a doctor's office, family living quarters and mother's art studio; Kate Traumann Steinitz, Lotti's mother, was an accomplished artist who had studied at the Ecole de la Grande Chaumiere in Paris.

In 1920, Dr. Steinitz was appointed head of internal medicine at the municipal hospital. He was involved in medical research, specializing in endocrinology. He set up a diabetes clinic, one of the first of its kind, and gradually built a prosperous private practice.

"Father was definitely the head of the family, but he respected and supported his wife's talents and indomitable independence," Ilse says. "He provided financial security; she created an exciting home environment. She could explore the local art scene and soon became part of it as both an artist and a patron."

Ilse remembers home as "a place of permanent sociability." The family's frequent guests included pioneering artists, writers, philosophers, musicians, actors, architects, educators and physicians. The children were always a part of these gatherings.

There were differences, however, between home and school, Ilse says: "Authoritarianism and censorship in the classroom, freedom to explore and question at the dinner table."

Lotti "did not like school," her sister recalls. "She was indomitably independent like her mother and wanted to choose her own learning style." Most teachers, in contrast, "resisted any kind of innovation which might

upset the establishment and endanger the privileges of bureaucracy and academia."

Lotti quit school in 1932, after the tenth grade. Instead, she became a gardener's apprentice at the Hannover municipal nursery. She was capable, happy, and well-liked, but after only one year, her apprenticeship came to an abrupt end.

Adolf Hitler came to power in 1933 and quickly enacted laws, which barred Jews from employment. Dr. Steinitz was dismissed from his hospital post. Lotti was fired from her job, and a few days later Kate was banned from membership in the German guild of writers and journalists. Newspapers and periodicals could no longer publish her stories, drawings, and photographs.

Convinced there was no future for his family in Germany, Dr. Steinitz located distant relatives in New York who supplied the affidavits required for immigration to the United States.

Lotti went to England in 1933 and lived as an au pair at a boarding school for girls, tutoring students in German in exchange for room and board. From 1934 to 1936 she attended Reading University in England completing a Diploma course in horticulture.

Her family had settled in New York City, and she joined them there. Soon, Lotti was offered an undergraduate scholarship to attend Pennsylvania State College.

While pursuing a major in horticulture with minors in plant breeding, chemistry, and genetics, her first published work appeared. The April 1937 issue of House and Garden Magazine featured an article entitled "Those English Lawns," which sparkles with bright imagery and the youthful confidence of its 20-year-old author. Lotti received her B.S. degree from Pennsylvania State in 1938 and immediately applied to graduate schools. She was accepted to the University of California, Berkeley, and was the first graduate student of the notable botanist and evolutionist, G. Ledyard Stebbins Jr. In 1942 Lotti received her Ph.D. in genetics from the University of California for a cytogenetic study of barley, which presaged her eventual work at the University of Missouri.

In 1943 Lotti became a U.S. citizen. This enabled her to take a post-doctoral fellowship working on the Government Penicillium Project in the Stanford University laboratory of George W. Beadle. When this project ended at the close of World War II, she worked in a succession of temporary positions in analytical chemistry, biochemistry and microbiology.

In C. Leonard Huskins' laboratory at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, Lotti again worked in cytogenetics, her preferred area of study. This job, too, she described to friends as "my temporary position." She applied to dozens of institutions, but with dwindling funding and the return of the war veterans, fewer jobs were available.

Lotti's qualifications were astonishing for a woman of her time. She not only had a broad educational foundation, a doctorate in a subject that was revolutionizing biology, and an impressive string of scholarships and fellowships, but was also fluent in German and English with reading ability in Russian and French.

Lloyd E. Thomas of the University of Missouri brought Lotti to Columbia on a cancer research grant. Lotti was already well acquainted with the genetics group at MU. Soon she met Ernie and fell in love. They were married in the summer of 1950.

---

#### Sears Science

Professor East had arranged for Ernie's meeting with Lewis J. Stadler, Associate Professor of Field Crops and Senior Geneticist of the United States Department of Agriculture at the University of Missouri-Columbia. Stadler conceived of a project involving wheat and wheat relatives to parallel the genetic studies in less complex species.

This was the first concerted effort to systematically apply cytogenetics and induced mutation to the study of wheat in the United States. The project involved Ernie Sears working primarily with wheat, his Bussey classmate, Joseph G. O'Mara, with interspecific hybrids, and Stadler's student Luther Smith with the wild species. The introduction to their joint First Annual Report in 1936 notes:

"Although most plants of agricultural importance are polyploids, nearly all our knowledge of heredity has come from investigations on non-polyploid organisms. This project was initiated to study the effects of polyploidy on genetic phenomena."

That first year, the three young investigators tried a variety of methods to create viable hybrids between wheat and rye and other related species. To create a fertile hybrid from such crosses, the chromosomes must be doubled in number. They tried all the reported methods of doubling chromosomes (the colchicine method was not described until the following year), but the experiment failed. However, from a large population of plants grown from the heat-shocked seed of 'Chinese Spring' wheat x rye, two plants were found that contained no rye chromosomes and only half a set of wheat chromosomes. These "haploid" plants produced no pollen and so were male-sterile. Ernie was curious to see if they were also female sterile so he hand fertilized the two plants with pollen from normal wheat and normal rye. One plant produced seed from both the rye and wheat pollinations. The latter seed was grown in the spring of 1937. At the end of 1937, he reported: "From this material it is planned to build up several stocks each monosomic for a different chromosome, and possibly to obtain plants entirely deficient for certain chromosomes. Such stocks might permit a genetic analysis of *T. vulgare* on a whole chromosome basis." Upon this foundation Ernie systematically constructed a series of wheat genetic seed stocks containing deficiencies or additions of each individual chromosome. It took 15 years of patient effort and some collaborations to complete this first

series of "aneuploids," which Ernie generously shared with anyone who requested them.

Another early work that had enormous consequences resulted from a brief collaboration in 1938 with E. S. McFadden, Agronomist at the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station. McFadden was a wheat breeder with an abiding interest in the evolution of wheat. His observations led him to believe that certain species of a genus called *Aegilops* may have been one of the ancestral parents of cultivated wheat. He suggested to Ernie that several crosses of these wild species (2X) with a tetraploid species (4X) might result in a synthetic version of common bread wheat (6X). A similar conclusion had been reached independently by Japanese wheat geneticist Hitoshi Kihara. Ernie's cross of *Triticum dicoccoides* x *Aegilops squarrosa* provided conclusive evidence of McFadden's and Kihara's theory. This was not the most significant outcome of the McFadden-Sears experiment. Another cross made in this study, *T. dicoccoides* x *Ae. umbellulata* (*T. umbellulatum*) proved to be far more important.

It happened that the original polyploid project was dismantled as a result of a reallocation of funds by the federal government. By 1943, Luther Smith had been moved to the Barley Project and Joseph O'Mara continued his Triticale (wheat-rye hybrid) work, independently. Ernie was put in charge of wheat research. For the next 20 years, his primary collaborators were wheat breeders and pathologists. The study of wheat genetics became problem-based. This turned out to be a useful focus. The work to create cytogenetic tools (the deficiencies, additions and substitutions of chromosomes) had to keep pace with the new goals of the project. These genetic stocks were very useful for determining the chromosomal location of disease resistance genes.

Epidemics of leaf and stem rust, bunt and mildews plagued wheat farmers. Breeders were interested in introducing some of the valuable characteristics of wild species into wheat. The species *Aegilops umbellulata* contained a high degree of resistance to leaf rust. Ernie, working with a cross he had made to test McFadden's evolutionary theory, was able, through a series of steps, to create a plant with a high degree of resistance to rust, that contained a complete set of wheat chromosomes and one chromosome of *Ae. umbellulata*. This plant formed the basis for an elegant feat of chromosome engineering, the incorporation of a small segment of an alien species into a wheat chromosome. Before this effort was concluded, however, hundreds of rust resistant wheat seeds were distributed to wheat breeders around the world. In the United States, several varieties containing this resistance were released commercially and grown on a considerable acreage. Thus Ernie was able to contribute directly to a vital sector of our agricultural economy. According to George P. Rédei, it has been estimated that this one accomplishment "resulted in a \$30 billion annual increase in revenue for the wheat farmers of the state of Kansas alone."

While it is impossible to enumerate here more than a few of the contributions that Ernie made to the genetics

and the agricultural communities, it is a testimony to his brilliance and his vision that many were conceived in the earliest years of his career. Furthermore, the ideas were brought to fruition patiently, thoroughly, systematically and sometimes single-handedly over the course of decades.

After 1950, Lotti's contributions were significant in moving the work forward. Many of the investigations of a purely cytogenetic nature were initiated by her. Other studies were jointly pursued. Among the most important of these was obtaining and analyzing the series of telocentric chromosomes, wheat lines with missing or added halves of chromosomes. This effort involved thousands of microscopic examinations of cells, work for which Lotti was perfectly prepared. Her cytogenetic skills were enlisted in the 1960s when pioneer Arabidopsis geneticist, George Rédei, called on Lotti to determine the chromosome constitution of his mutant lines. In a memorial letter, George Rédei elaborated on Lotti's work: "Actually, she was the first who photographed karyotypes of Arabidopsis which not only settled definitely the number of chromosomes but displayed so much detail on the structure of these small chromosomes that nobody could duplicate it for over 20 years. Encouraged by these initial successes, with a graduate student, Suzanne Lee-Chen, an now accomplished clinical cytologist, they isolated, for the first time, the five primary trisomics and one telotrisomic of Arabidopsis. This opened a new window on genetic mapping."

During this time, Lotti and Ernie raised a family of four children, treated their graduate students as family members and hosted numerous visiting scientists, often in their own home. They traveled far and wide making friends, sharing ideas and cooperating on useful projects. The respect and admiration they generated reflected merit on the University of Missouri at Columbia throughout the 20th century
