

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Introduction

The following pages list data for all known family members as of 21st September 2020.

Each immediate family is presented in their own section that contains a graphical family tree as well as a description with information about each referenced person and their children. The child section provides information about the children of the preceding couple. When a child has offspring of their own this is presented in a separate family section for that child. In this case a '+' is used to denote that an individual will appear later in the book as a parent with his/her own children and there is a link to the appropriate family reference number. For children with partners but no offspring the partner data is given with the reference family. Roman numerals, followed by a period, are used to indicate the birth order.

In the chapter titled "Family of the Starting Person" the ancestors of Jasper Sears are presented in a kind of enhanced Pedigree Chart which displays the graphic representation of their direct-line ancestors and the children of the couple. This chapter contains information about the couple whose relatives are listed in the later chapters.


The chapter titled "Families of his Ancestors" provides details (as known as of the publication date) for the relatives of Jasper Sears. There is a chapter for each generation. Relatives are listed in the order of the nearness of their relationship.

Sources for the information provided are given in the footnotes.

This document reports the details of 90 individuals, of whom 47 are male and 43 are female. Of the 42 individuals with recorded birth and death dates, the average lifespan was 51.38 years. Of these, 26 males averaged 47.35 years, and 16 females averaged 57.94 years. The longest living male was Richard Parsons Sears (1887–1972), who died aged 84. The longest living female was Sylvia M Mattes (1891–1977), who died aged 85.

1. Col Jasper Peck⁶ Sears (*Capt* John⁵, John⁴, Richard³, Silas², Richard¹) was born on Thursday, 7th July 1763, in Lyme, New London, Connecticut, USA.^[1-3] He was the son of John Sears (4) and Judith Peck (3).

Jasper Peck was christened on 4^{th} August 1771. He died in West Bloomfield, Ontario, New York, on 17^{th} May 1811, at the age of 47. [1, 2] Jasper Peck was buried in West Bloomfield, Ontario County. [2]

!S P May gr-st, p.287 Jasper Sears emigrated to West Bloomfield, Ont. co., NY, then called the "Genesco settlement," in 1790, in company with Mr Clark Peck and Mr Marvin. They bought farms together, their purchase being a mile square. Col Sears, as he was styled, kept the pioneer-tayern, and his farm is now occupied by Henry C Brown, son-in-law of Simeon Sears, No.1041 !May copied an article from the Sunday Sun, 14 Jun 1885: Mr Coddington was born in Northumberland co, PA, in 1787, and came with his parents to Tompkins co in 1803, when what is now the town of Hector was but little better than a wilderness. The Cossingtons took up land in the forest, and the settler, with the aid of his son John, in three years cleared up a fine farm. In Jun 1806, a man named Jasper Sears, who lived in New Bloomfield, Ontario co, stopped at Coddington's clearing, and while there hired young John to go to New Bloomfield and work for him for \$7 a month. When the young man started from home the next week to take the job, all the money his father had to give him was three silver sixpences. This was the first pay John Coddington ever received. The distance to New Bloomfield was seventy-five miles, and the journey was to be made on foot, through an almost trackless forest. On the site of that forest, and along the route travelled by the young pioneer, now stand some of the most populous and thriving towns and villages in the State. Geneva and Canandaigua then had each about twenty small houses. Young Coddington used one of his sixpences to pay for being ferried across Seneca River, on the evening of his first day's journey, and to pay for lodging on the floor of the ferryman's house and a bowl of bread and milk in the morning. The next day he spent another sixpence at Canandaigua settlement for a glass of ale and a piece of gingerbread, arriving at Sears's that night with but one sixpence left. He walked the seventy-five miles in two days, and had nothing but the bread and milk, the ale, and the gingerbread on the way. He worked until the first of the next January for Sears when drew the \$40 that was due him and returned home, walking the distance in twenty hours.

The adjutant-general gives, in his report for 1809, a total enrollment of the various branches of service of one hundred and two thousand and sixty-eight men. In 1811, military stores had been deposited among other places at Onondaga, Canandaigua and Batavia. Cannon of various caliber were stored at these magazines. Heavy ordnance, designed for the Niagara frontier, was brought from Albany by water to West Cayuga, now Bridgeport, and thence transported on heavy sleds built for the purpose to their destination.


