

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Introduction

The following pages list data for all known family members as of 2nd January 2021.

Each immediate family is presented in their own section that contains a graphical family tree as well as a description with information about each referenced person and their children. The child section provides information about the children of the preceding couple. When a child has offspring of their own this is presented in a separate family section for that child. In this case a '+' is used to denote that an individual will appear later in the book as a parent with his/her own children and there is a link to the appropriate family reference number. For children with partners but no offspring the partner data is given with the reference family. Roman numerals, followed by a period, are used to indicate the birth order.

In the chapter titled "Families of the Starting Person" the ancestors of Josephus Sears are presented in a kind of enhanced Pedigree Chart which displays the graphic representation of their direct-line ancestors and the children of the couple. This chapter contains information about the couple whose relatives are listed in the later chapters.

The chapter titled "Families of his Ancestors" provides details (as known as of the publication date) for the relatives of Josephus Sears. There is a chapter for each generation. Relatives are listed in the order of the nearness of their relationship.

Sources for the information provided are given in the footnotes.

This document reports the details of 275 individuals, of whom 145 are male and 128 are female. The sex of 2 individuals is unknown. Of the 173 individuals with recorded birth and death dates, the average lifespan was 61.5 years. Of these, 88 males averaged 65 years, and 83 females averaged 58.8 years. The longest living male was William White (1721–1817), who died aged 96. The longest living female was Keziah Sickler (1828–1926), who died aged 97.





Figure 2: SPM218A



Catherine was born in Egg Harbor City on Monday, 15^{th} November 1762.^[1] She reached 48 years of age and died on 22^{nd} May 1811.^[1] Catherine was buried in Tuckerton, Ocean.^[1]

4. Parnell³ Hammond (*Josephus*²) was born on 24th March 1736, in Rochester, Plymouth, Massachusetts, USA.^[3] She was the daughter of Josephus Hammond (37) and Thankful Winslow (38).

Parnell died in Bass River, Burlington, New Jersey, on 22nd January 1817, at the age of 80.^[3] She was buried in Pleasant Mills, Atlantic.^[3]

!From James J Ludwigsen The unusual name, Parnel, accent on the first syllable, and the fact that she was not only descended from prominent Pilgrim and Puritan families, but has many namesakes, both male and female, within the circle of the reader of "The Observer" who will be interested in herself and her honorable ancestry particularly in that through her they too are descendants of good old New England stock, constitutes the occasion of this article.

Benjamin Hammond, born in London, England, in 1621, was the founder of the town of Rochester, Massachusetts, dying there in 1703, he being the ancestor of one branch of the Hammond family in New England was the great-great-grandfather of Parnel Hammond and, well, say, for instance, Walter Simmermon, son of Albertus and Irene (nee Sickler) Simmermon, this lad being Parnel Hammond's great-great-great grandson, both through his father's and his mother's line of descent, both of his parents being in the same generation from her and consequently, as we shall see later, directly descended from Edward Winslow, who came over on the Mayflower in 1620 and later became governor of Plymouth Colony. Benjamin Hammond's father was William Hammond and his mother, Elizabeth Penn, was a sister to the father of William Penn, founder of Philadelphia and for whom Pennsylvania was named, a collateral relationship of which several Williamstown families may well be proud. Parnel Hammond's father, Josephus Hammond, was the grandson of Benjamin and Thankful(her mother) Winslow, was great-great granddaughter of Edward Winslow, governor of Plymouth

Colony, and author of "Good News from England" and so valued had this piece of literature become in 1900 that a copy of it sold at a sale in London for twelve hundred dollars. Parnel, their first child, born March 24, 1736, at Rochester, Massachusetts, married when about twenty years old Captain Paul Sears, who in his coasting trade carried cedar lumber from Egg Harbor district of Southern New Jersey in his vessel "The Adventure," but Captain Paul Sears died at sea after the birth of their first child, Paul Hammond Sears, [conflict here with other records] the young widow married for her second husband, William Coffin, who went ot the New Jersey cedar swamps, to work cedar, a passenger in Captain Sears Vessel. Her children by Coffin were Parnel, born Jun 20 1773, married Cornelius Tice, brother of Major John Tice who settled in Squakum, now Williamstown about 1798, and her second child by her second marriage was William Coffin who married Ann Bodine, a cousin of the Williamstown Bodines, Joel Bodine.

Parnel Hammond Sears Coffin became the second time a widow when William Coffin died of smallpox at Green Bank, Burlington County, about 1770. The hut in which he died burned up together with whatever papers they might have possessed. However she married the third time to Burdsall Tyler, but the union proved a failure too, separating in a short time and she finally ended her days with her son William Coffin, who becoming a glass manufacturer at Hammonton and Winslow, naming those towns for his two sons, John Hammond and Edward Winslow, the latter of whom is yet living and from whom I obtained the data for this sketch.


Her tombstone at Pleasant Mills, New Jersey, bears this inscription: "In memory of Parnel Tyler, late widow in their turn to Paul Sears and William Coffin, deceased, who departed this life January 22, 1817, in the Eighty Second year of her age.

Paul Hammond Sears, her only son by her first husband is a historical character of Squakum-Williamstown, prominent in the local affairs of the first half of the last century, his name appearing in "Barber & Howe's Historical Collections of New Jersey" and he it was who presided at the meeting held at the School House, February 8, 1841 when the name of Williamstown superceded the old Indian Term, Squakum. According to his epitaph in the church yard, he was born in 1770 and died in 1848, however another date of his birth found, makes it 1758, but anyway, he was Parnel Hammond Sears Coffin Tyler's son and the link through whom quite a large number of our local citizens are entitled to membership in the aristocratic and exclusive colonial societies which citizens are here noted:

All the descendants of William Sickler, and Parnel Sears, of Horatio Simmermon and Patience Sears , besides Parnel Hammond's children by her second husband, Parnel Coffin and Cornelius Tice, and William Coffin and Ann Bodine. The descendants of the last named are aware of their honorable descent and need no prompting but some of the Sicklers, Tices, Prossers, Fislers, Irelands, Eldridges, Deharts, Whites and many others too numerous to mention, have yet to know that through parnel Hammond they are heirs to Pilgrim, Puritan and old Colonial genealogical glory. 




Figure 3: SPM132A








Figure 9: SPM228




Figure 10: SPM229





Figure 11: 1840 United States Federal Census





Figure 15: 1880 United States Federal Census




Figure 17: SPM82





Figure 19: U.S., Sons of the American Revolution Membership Applications, 1889-1970







Figure 20: SPM132




Figure 21: U.S., Sons of the American Revolution Membership Applications, 1889-1970






Figure 22: SPM132




Figure 23: SPM133




Figure 24: SPM134




Figure 25: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988








Figure 28: SPM217




Figure 27: SPM216

Figure 29: Deacon Ebenezer Sears - death announced 08Feb1849 Semi-Weekly Eagle of Battleboro VT






Figure 30: North America, Family Histories, 1500-2000




Figure 33: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988






Figure 34: Vermont, Vital Records, 1720-1908

*Source of Information: The Cleveland Enterprise, 14 January 1922, "The Spirit of Our Pioneers" by Jane Elliot Snow, part 17: It is noticeable that in many of the townships of this county (Cuyahoga), a few names bore prominence over all others, during the days of their early settlement. In Olmsted township the names of Fitch and Stearns appear to have taken the lead. Mingled with these names that of Thompson comes in, possibly a little later, in point of time. One of the "real daughters" of these families has furnished the writer with a sketch of Priscilla Thompson, nee Sears, one of the leading characters of Olmstead in pioneer times. The story of this woman is vouched for as being absolutely true, and also of never having before appeared in print.

Priscilla Sears was born in Massachusetts, June 6, 1771, and was four years old when

the Battle of Bunker Hill was fought. She well remembered the sound of the guns and the sight of the smoke of that battle.

Her brother was there and she climbed up onto a high wood pile to try to pick him out from among the company of "Minute Men" there engaged. As Priscilla grew to womanhood, she at one time worked twelve weeks, and earned twelve silver dollars. Six of these she later gave to a jeweler to pay him for making half a dozen teaspoons from the other six dollars.

A little girl, who has to prefix the word "great" four times before grandmother, to show her relationship, is now the proud possessor of one of these spoons. Possibly it was when Priscilla Sears thought of marriage that she had her silver dollars changed into spoons, for about 1790 she was wedded to Jonathan Thompson, Jr., and with him moved to Vermont.

Before the invention of the cotton gin, and even for many years after, cotton goods were too expensive for ordinary use, and only homespun fabrics were used. Sheep were always kept, and flax raised in abundance on the farm. Priscilla Thompson kept her large family well supplied with woolen clothing and bedding for winter, and linen for summer wear, and for tablecloths and towels. The beds were made of linen ticking, filled with straw or feathers, one of each placed on a high post bedstead, supported by a lacing of rope from rail to rail of the bedstead, both crosswise and lengthwise.

All of the spinning, weaving and sewing was done by Priscilla, assisted by her daughters, after they were old enough to learn the arts. Even the thread with which the garments were sewed was homespun linen.

As the years went by the children married and moved to the west. Left quite alone Jonathan and Priscilla followed them, and settled in their midst, on Butternut Ridge, in 1827 in what is now North Olmsted. Priscilla's mother, Mrs. Betsy Sears (Stearns?) was at this time 83 (?) years old. As her children felt that the trip from Vermont to Ohio in a farm wagon was too strenuous for one of her years she was left behind in the care of another daughter.

Not long thereafter Priscilla Thompson received a letter telling her that her mother had had a stroke, that left her speechless and nearly helpless. This letter was soon followed by another, which told of the death of the sister.

Here was a situation that demanded immediate action. An invalid mother in Vermont, the only daughter that could care for her far away in the wilds of Ohio.
It was said of Priscilla that "When she saw her duty, no power on earth could prevent her doing it."

She straightway fitted up a one-horse wagon with such comforts as would be needed for the trip, and started back, alone, to Vermont for her mother. At this time there was not a railroad in the United States. Wagon roads were poor and along much of her journey there was only a trail marked by blazed trees through an unbroken wilderness, where wild animals were frequently seen. After a number of weeks she returned home bringing with her, her paralyzed mother, whom she cared for until her death, which occurred in 1830. Mrs. Thompson was a member of the Baptist church and a great Bible student. As her days were filled with manual work, it was her custom to rise at 4 in the morning any spend one hour reading the Bible, before beginning and labors of the day.

At the age of 70 she spun and wove enough table linen and toweling to last the rest of her life as she said, "she wouldn't have to work so hard when she was old."

When she was 78, a greatgranddaughter was born, who was named Priscilla for her, and also for her daughter, the infant's grandmother. If the first present to that child could be silver it would mean good luck. Mrs. Thompson had heard the baby's grandfather say he was going to give the little Priscilla a sheep. Said grandfather was best known as Vespasian, called "Pash" by his immediate family.

It was March, a south wind was fast melting the winter snow.

Priscilla Thompson reasoned thus: "The best way for Vespasian to take the sheep over to the baby will be in the sleigh. He will have to go soon or the snow will be gone. He will probably go in the morning. I must get there with one of my spoons before Vespasian gets there with his sheep." Now Priscilla lived only a few rods from the grandfather's house, but a long mile and a half from the baby's home. To go by the highway she must necessarily pass his house. If he saw her, he would insist upon her riding with him, then both presents would reach their destination at the same time, which would not do. So Priscilla rose early and walked through the woods and damp snow.

There was a creek running through the woods which in ordinary weather could be crossed on a fallen log. It was now so swollen by the spring freshet that the log had been washed away. Nothing daunted, she found a pole, and selecting a place where the stream was narrowest, vaulted over it and continued on her way. She reached her destination with wet feet, skirts drabbled to the knees, and all out of breath. She rushed into the house and threw one of the silver spoons, which she had earned sixty years before, into the cradle, saying, "There, I did get here before Pash did anyway!"

The grandfather arrived soon after with his sheep, and they returned together in the sleigh. Priscilla never wore glasses, but did her reading with a small magnifying glass that she moved back and forth across the printed page. Crittendon's jewelry store was the only place in Cleveland at that time where spectacles were sold.

On her eighty-seventh birthday, her son, Daniel, drove to the city with her to buy a pair of spectacles, she having decided to try them. But there was not a pair in Cleveland strong enough for her eyes, and she was forced to return without them. Old people were not as numerous in Cuyahoga county then as now, as most of the pioneers were of a younger generation.

The autumn following her eightyseventh birthday anniversary, Mrs. Thompson called at her son Daniel's home, and said she was going to John Ames'. Daniel lived about half way between her home and Ames', and a half mile from either place. He urged her to let him hitch up his horse and take her, but she insisted she would go alone. About three weeks later she again stopped at her son's on her way to the same place. This time she was prevailed upon to drive his horse, although she insisted on going alone.

In February she was taken ill, and no one realized better than she, that the end was near. The second night two granddaughters waited on her as she sat in her chair. After repeated suggestions that she go to bed she said, "I won't go to bed. I've never turned my back on an enemy, and I will meet death face to face!"

The next day she sat up in bed, one of her sons supporting her. She asked, "Alden, would you be scart if

I died here in your arms?"

"No, mother," he answered. "All Right," she said. Then she requested the Rev. Mr. Dimmick, who was present, to lead in prayer. After that, she asked those present to sing "Rock of Ages," and though her voice was very weak, she sang the hymn through with the rest.

"Now lay me down," she said. Her son gently laid her back on the pillow. She folded her hands across her breast and fell asleep.

John Ames was the local undertaker, and manufacturer of burial cases, but did not keep a stock on hand. After Priscilla died the family sent for him to come and measure her for a coffin. In response to the call he said, "Her coffin is made. Last fall she came and ordered it, and gave minute directions how it should be made. She even got into it to see if it fitted. She pronounced it satisfactory, and paid for it!" Her burial clothes, all made with her own hands, had long been laid aside, ready for the final need.

At the time of Priscilla Thompson's death, she had 110 living descendants. Some of her descendants are in Olmsted, Ohio, today. Others are living in other states, possibly other lands. She married Jonathan Thompson Jr. (215).








Figure 35: Record of intent to marry




Figure 38: SPM218




Figure 40: 1810 United States Federal Census




Figure 42: U.S. Pensioners, 1818-1872




Figure 45: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988




Figure 46: New Hampshire, Death and Disinterment Records, 1754-1947





Figure 47: Vermont, Vital Records, 1720-1908




Figure 49: SPM220



Figure 50: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988




Figure 51: Massachusetts, Wills and Probate Records, 1635-1991




Figure 52: North America, Family Histories, 1500-2000




Figure 53: spm221






Figure 54: Sickler_will 006






Figure 55: Sickler_will 007





Figure 57: New Jersey, Marriage Records, 1670-1965





Figure 58: 1870 United States Federal Census





Figure 59: 1880 United States Federal Census
