

Introduction

The following pages list data for all known family members as of 13th October 2020.

Each immediate family is presented in their own section that contains a graphical family tree as well as a description with information about each referenced person and their children. The child section provides information about the children of the preceding couple. When a child has offspring of their own this is presented in a separate family section for that child. In this case a '+' is used to denote that an individual will appear later in the book as a parent with his/her own children and there is a link to the appropriate family reference number. For children with partners but no offspring the partner data is given with the reference family. Roman numerals, followed by a period, are used to indicate the birth order.

In the chapter titled "Family of the Starting Person" the ancestors of Paul Sears are presented in a kind of enhanced Pedigree Chart which displays the graphic representation of their direct-line ancestors and the children of the couple. This chapter contains information about the couple whose relatives are listed in the later chapters.


The chapter titled "Families of his Ancestors" provides details (as known as of the publication date) for the relatives of Paul Sears. There is a chapter for each generation. Relatives are listed in the order of the nearness of their relationship.

Sources for the information provided are given in the footnotes.

This document reports the details of 411 individuals, of whom 200 are male and 210 are female. The sex of one individual is unknown. Of the 255 individuals with recorded birth and death dates, the average lifespan was 60.16 years. Of these, 126 males averaged 63.16 years, and 128 females averaged 57.68 years. The longest living male was Elijah Clark Sears (1805–1910), who died aged 105. The longest living female was Mrs Lydia (Lyon) Knight (1754–1850), who died aged 96.







The original spelling of my husband's Handy lineage was "Hendee" and morphed into its current spelling during the mid 1700's to early 1800's. Richard Hendee arrived in the colonies on the Hopewell in 1634 and settled in Connecticut. As far as I can tell, the Handy's of Massachusetts are not his ancestors unless they go back into England before coming to the colonies.

The children of Paul and Elizabeth Sears were all born in Sandisfield, Berkshire, Massachusetts (abbreviation Sand.), not Sandwich, Barnstable, Massachusetts. I have the birth records from the state of Massachusetts, which [I am sure] is where S.P. May got his information from.

I believe the reference to Elizabeth Sears marrying a Handy in many of the online lineages is a mistake. Someone confused Nancy Sears' marriage to a Handy with Elizabeth and the bad habit of copying lineages without vetting continues the information. As I indicated in my last email, Elizabeth Sears (of Sandisfield, MA) married Lemuel Sizer by 1791. This may have been her 2nd marriage and she may have married a Handy prior, but I don't think so. Unfortunately, I have not been able to find marriage records for either sister and am having to use secondary sources. (I see you have changed the information about Elizabeth on WikiTree ①)

Cyrenus Handy settled in Colebrook, Connecticut with his extended family circa 1781. Property records show the land they settled was about 8 miles (current roads) to where the approximate property of Paul Sears was in Sandisfield, Massachusetts. The Sears lived along the Clam River which drains into the Farmington River. The Handys lived near the Farmington River. It isn't hard to imagine travel between the two locations may have been easier along the water route.

Nancy Handy was witness to two land transactions between her husband and (3) children in 1817. She was made administrator, along with son, Hiram, of Cyrenus' estate in 1823. The 1880 census for son James Handy, indicates that his mother was born in Massachusetts. The information on the 1800 and 1810 censuses narrows her birth to between 1766 and 1774. Given this information, I did a broad search on FamilySearch.org starting with the Massachusetts counties that border Connecticut. Berkshire county gave two hits. Only one, Nancy Sears, was viable. The information from Samuel P May makes the connection more credible, although I would feel more confident if he had a source for his information.


I can now only hope that somewhere there is a family bible, diary, letters, etc. that would clearly show Nancy Sears married Cyrenus Handy.

Hello,

I am researching the Handy family of Colebrook, Connecticut. I have come across your research, both on Wikitree and your published [1st edition] book. You list Elizabeth, the daughter of Paul Sears (1740-1832) and Elizabeth Slawter (-1800), as having married a Handy. My research shows Elizabeth married Lemuel Sizer (1759-1831). She was married to him by December 21, 1791, as she and her husband appeared before a justice of the peace after signing a land deed.

The book, "The Descendants of Richard Sares (Sears)", by Samuel P. Mays, gives no husband for Elizabeth, but shows her sister, Nancy Sears, married _____ Handy. Unfortunately, there is no document referenced. I believe Nancy married Cyrenus Handy (1764-1823) based on secondary documents. I am currently writing a proof argument, but would appreciate any information you might have concerning the "marriage" of Elizabeth to a Handy or have proof of a Handy marrying Nancy. Any relationship of the Sears family to the Handys would be helpful.

The original spelling of my husband's Handy lineage was "Hendee" and morphed into its current spelling during the mid 1700's to early 1800's. Richard Hendee arrived in the colonies on the Hopewell in 1634 and settled in Connecticut. As far as I can tell, the Handy's of Massachusetts are not his ancestors unless they go back into England before coming to the colonies.

The children of Paul and Elizabeth Sears were all born in Sandisfield, Berkshire, Massachusetts (abbreviation Sand.), not Sandwich, Barnstable, Massachusetts. I have the birth records from the state of Massachusetts, which [I am sure] is where S.P. May got his information from.

I believe the reference to Elizabeth Sears marrying a Handy in many of the online lineages is a mistake. Someone confused Nancy Sears' marriage to a Handy with Elizabeth and the bad habit of copying lineages without vetting continues the information. As I indicated in my last email, Elizabeth Sears (of Sandisfield,

MA) married Lemuel Sizer by 1791. This may have been her 2nd marriage and she may have married a Handy prior, but I don't think so. Unfortunately, I have not been able to find marriage records for either sister and am having to use secondary sources. (I see you have changed the information about Elizabeth on WikiTree ①)

Cyrenus Handy settled in Colebrook, Connecticut with his extended family circa 1781. Property records show the land they settled was about 8 miles (current roads) to where the approximate property of Paul Sears was in Sandisfield, Massachusetts. The Sears lived along the Clam River which drains into the Farmington River. The Handys lived near the Farmington River. It isn't hard to imagine travel between the two locations may have been easier along the water route.

Nancy Handy was witness to two land transactions between her husband and (3) children in 1817. She was made administrator, along with son, Hiram, of Cyrenus' estate in 1823. The 1880 census for son James Handy, indicates that his mother was born in Massachusetts. The information on the 1800 and 1810 censuses narrows her birth to between 1766 and 1774. Given this information, I did a broad search on FamilySearch.org starting with the Massachusetts counties that border Connecticut. Berkshire county gave two hits. Only one, Nancy Sears, was viable. The information from Samuel P May makes the connection more credible, although I would feel more confident if he had a source for his information.

I can now only hope that somewhere there is a family bible, diary, letters, etc. that would clearly show Nancy Sears married Cyrenus Handy.

Although Barnas was his favorite, he was very impatient at his fondness for books, and when he found him stretched under the shade of a tree, or sheltered from sight in any sequestered nook, he would chide him for laziness, and not unfrequently lay his riding whip In spite of his fault-finding, however, he was proud of his talents, and in later life about the boy's legs. often said, he "always knew that youngster would make his mark." While religious in the deepest and truest meaning of the word, Dr Sears was neither sectarian or narrow minded. He had a broad catholic spirit, and saw good in all men. When others were sitting in harshest judgement on some unfortunate one, after death, were a few rules for self-government. One was, "Criticise yourself severly, others mildly." Another was, "If not able to say a kind thing of the absent, keep silent." These maxims were most faithfully observed. He had inherited a quick temper, but by the time his family were grown, he had it under perfect control. After he died, an old colored man-servent, who had lived with him for many years, told his associates that he had never heard his master speak angrily, and a colored girl who waited on Mrs Sears seventeen years bore the same testimony. Every one loved him who served him, and while the whole country took sad note of his death, there was no sincerer regret anywhere than amongst the humble poor, who were connected with him in domestic life.

The synonyms with which it supplies us greatly increase and facilitate our command of expression; and the idiomatic phrases which are classified in their intellectual, not alphabetical, connection, are the greatest helps that could be furnished to the young composer or conversationist. With the common dictionary the purpose is to explain the meaning or idea of a given word. With the ?Thesaurus,? the object is very usefully reversed, and we are furnished with a variety of words to suit the expression or conveyance of a given idea. In addition to the complete work of Roget, the American editor has supplied us with an alphabeticalist of all the foreign words and expressions which we most frequently meet with in works of general literature; these auotations embrace the phrases most frequently made use of from the French, Italian, Spanish, Greek, and German languages. No higher commendation of the care, good taste, and judgment with which this volume has been revised and enlarged by its present editor, can be given, than the mention of the fact that its author, in the later editions of his work, has adopted its American form, and incorporated (though without

acknowledging) a great number of the additions and improvements made on this side of the Atlantic. To those who aspire to facility and elegance of diction, this volume will prove an invaluable help. We wish, with all our hearts, for the sake of our noble mother tongue, that this verbal treasury may be read and ransacked as widely as it is capable of diffusing information. Another reviewer speaks of his ROGET?S THESAURUS,-The appearance of a second American edition of this valuable work, reminds us of its curious experiences in the hands of its editor, .Mr. Sears. In the first edition, he felt constrained, by we know not what prudery, to omit a large part of the English edition, consisting of ?vulgar words and phrases,? as they were termed. We protested against the omission, on the ground that the words and phrases, so excluded, were not vulgar, in any offensive sense, but simply idiomatic, that they were used by the best writers, and of indispensable service to an easy and popular style of composition. Others appear to have done the same thing, for Mr. Sears, in this second edition, has collected his discharged vulgarians, and marshaled them together under a head by themselves. He cannot admit them among his saintly or classical words, and yet, as they have an allowed currency in literature, he concludes that their? apprehended injury to the taste of students and younger readers is obviated,? by incorporating them into a separate appendix. Now, we have two things to say in reference to this procedure. In the first place, that if these words are likely to do injury at all, they are more likely to do it, standing in a separate list, than if they had been left in the midst of a multitude of others. They are more likely to catch the eye of ?students and younger readers? as they are now placed, than they are as they stand in Roget?s original arrangement. But, in the second place, very few of them are likely to do injury at all, and are just as ?classical,? by which we mean proper, as the words and phrases which are not in quarantine. Let us compare a few of them, for examples. Among ?English words and phrases, which, though not classical, with few exceptions, have an acknowledged currency, ~~ we take from the first page of the appendix the following ABODE, -pen, casement, thorp, ham, suburb, province, country, wynd. Turning to the same word, in the body of the book, we find ABODE, dwelling, lodging, domicile, residence, address, habitation, local habitation, berth, seat, lap, sojourn, housing, quarters, head-quarters, tabernacle. Now, we should like to know why it would be less ?classical? to use the words suburb or province, as an analogue for the place of one?s abode, than to use domsei2e or tabernacle? Are not the words of the appendix quite as legitimate, in the connection, as the others, and would they not be, in many phrases that we may construct, more convenient and easy? Again, under the next word, absurdity, we have in the appendix ABSURDITY, (phrases) a cock and bullstory; a mare?s nest; a wild-goose chase; fiddle-faddle; neither rhyme nor reason.: On the other hand, in the body of the book, we have ABSURDITY, absurdness, nonsense, paradox, quibble, bull, jargon, gibberish, rigmarole, fustian, rant, bathos, rhodomon tade, twaddle, fudge, balderdash, palaver, moonshine, wishwash, flummery, monkeytrick, &c., &c. But why is not fiddle-faddle as good as wishwash, moonshine, or fustian? Is a wild-goose chase less respectable than monkey-trick, or a mare?s nest less classical than rigmarole? Under the head of Music, page 460, we are told that aria, fantasia, jig, fugue, eanzonet, canon, catch and madrigal are not classical, -but under the head of Music, page 134, we find that air, symphony, solo, duet, fugue, eanzonet, canticle, lullaby, requiem, &c., &c., are classical. Pray, by what rule is it discovered that fugue and canzonet are both classical and not classical, or by what rule is lullaby classical, and madrigal not,-or symphony classical, and fantasia not? Among the phrases which Mr. Sears has banished from the body of the work, and put into a kind of Coventry into the appendix, are such as these :-" to throw in one?s teeth," "to feather one?s nest," "to look sharp," "to have a hand in,? ?the ups and downs of life,? ?to cut capers," "to lay about one,? ?to run a muck,? "to bear in mind," "to lead by the hand," "to wear the ???brehs," "to raise the wind,? ?cock-a-hoop,? ?to drive a trade,? ?as luck would have it,? ?cool as a cucumber," "to keep dark," "to take the bull by the horns," "to gild the pill," "deaf as a post," "in the sulks," "nothing loth," "to rap the knuckles," "to leave in the lurch," and a thousand more, equally familiar and innocent. The worst that can be said of these phrases is, that they have been so often used as to have become trite, but many of them are as much a part of the language, as statelier words in -ation and -ology. It seems to us, therefore, that Mr. Sears has been making distinctions where there were no differences, and that the effect of his meddling with Prof. Roget?s book has been to render it more difficult of use, by multiplying the divisions. He has compensated for this, in part, by correcting errors and enlarging the index; but in the next edition we hope the poor outcasts of the appendix, if found worthy of print at all, will be restored to their appropriate places in the body of the book. His original American ancestor was Richard Sears, a member of a family noted in English history, who landed at Yarmouth, Mass., in 1630. The family remained at Cape Cod until the time of Pres. Sears' grandfather, who removed to Berkshire county with his brother Elkanah. Barnas Sears spent his early life on his father's farm, and at the age of fifteen commenced his life career as a builder of stone walls in the summer, and as teacher in winter, at the same time prosecuting his studies with the help and encouragement of a young college student. Determining to prepare himself for the ministry, he began preparatory studyes with "Parson" Cooley of East Granville, Mass., a noted teacher of youth in his day, and later also studied at the Brown University Grammar School, then under the charge of Jesse Hartwell. Finally entering Brown University, he was graduated with high honors in the class of 1825, delivering at commencement an oration on "The Influence of Association Upon the Intellectual Character." Meanwhile he had entered upon the work of the ministry, having commenced preaching in his sophomore year, and immediately after graduation entered the Newton Theological Institution, where he remained two years. He then accepted the pastorate f the First Baptist Church of Hartford, Conn., but resigned in 1829, to become professor of ancient languages in the Hamilton Literary and Theological Institution (now Colgate University), New York. While at Hamilton he acted as pastor of the Baptist Church, and also interested himself actively in the theological department of the college. Having been appointed professor of Biblical theology, he sought further preparation for his duties by two years study at the universities of Halle, Leipsic and Berlin, sitting under the instruction of Gesenius, Resenmueller, Winer, Neander and other masters of Biblical and historical research. At Hamburg in 1834, he secretly immersed in the Elbe by night Rev. J.G. Oncken and six others, thus starting a movement which, by the devoted self-sacrifice of its originators, has gone on in spite of persecution until the German Baptists now number some 130 societies and nearly 30,000 members. Dr. Sears doubtless did much besides to encourage the movement in its infancy. On his return home in 1835, he resumed work at Hamilton, but at the end of six months accepted a professorship at the Newton Theological Institution, where he remained until 1848, serving as president during the last

nine years. He was also a member of the Massachusetts board of education for several yars, and in 1848 upon the resignation of Horace Mann, was appointed its secretary. In this office he proved himself in all respects worthy his predecessor, being, by his broad scholarship and long experience in teaching, fully fitted to continue the important reforms in educational theory and methods so ably inaugurated. Hon. George S. Boutwell said of Dr. Sears' work: "What had been regarded in Mr. Mann's time by many as experimental, became under Dr. Sears' an established and recognized institution of the state. Our system of education--schools for all the people and sustained by the people was placed upon a foundation as immovable as the foundation of the state itself." in 1855 he was elected president of Brown University; passing from an office where he had had as predecessor one illustrious educator to take up and carry on the work of another, who was, after Dr. Nott, the greatest of American college presidents. Although in many respects guite the opposite of Pres. Wayland, he soon won the confidence and affection of the students and all the friends of Brown. In accordance with his enlightened theories of education, he abolished many of the minor penalties of the college discipline, and also revised the marking and grading system so as to record the general progress and attainment of the student rather than the accidental merit or demerit of any single recitation. One of his pupils writes of him: "Whatever other testimonies his memory may receive, the students of Brown during these years wil pay the tribute of love. For Dr. Sears was, above all, perhaps a loved president. The students in his classes were led, not driven." Prof. Lincoln says "Of all the administrators of the affairs of the college no one was more highly esteemed andmore truly loved during all the time of his administariton than Pres. Sears. I remember how he awakened our admiration by the stores of knowledge which he had always ready at either hand; how he impressed all with profound respect for religion and love for God." BUt a man of Sears' scholarship and executive ability could not fail to mould and improve the curriculum of the college, little probably as remained to be effected after Wayland's brilliant administration. Among notable benefits under his direction was the introduction of the methods and results of German research, and in this cause he was one of the true pioneers of America. During his adminstration also, a system of scholarships was founded, somewhat on the lines contemplated by Pres. Manning int he first days of the college. This laudable work was made possible by the vote of the corporation in 1858, appropriating the fund left by Nicholas Brown to the formation of eleven scholarships of \$1,000 each; and upon this beginning the benefactions have so increased from year to year that there are at the present time (1898) over 100 scholarships open to deserving students. The equipment of the university was enlarged in 1862 by the acquisition from the state of agricultural department and the erection of the chemical laboratory building. Although Pres. Sears worked slowly and unostentatiously, his fame as an organizer and executive spread throughout the country. In 1867 he was requested by Robert C Winthrop to outline a scheme of management for the Peabody Trust Fund for the promotion of education in the more destitute portions of the sourhern and southwestern states, and responded in a letter which caused the general agencyto be offered to him. In this office he continued until his death, by his skillful management greatly augmenting it sphere of usefulness. The degree of D.D. was conferred on Pres. Sears by Harvard College in 1841, and LL.D. by Yale in 1862. During 1836-39 he was editor of the "Christian Review," and among his principal publications are: "Classical Studies" (1843); "Ciceroniana" (1849); "Life of Luther" (1850); and his editions of "Noehden's German Grammar" (1842); "Select Writings of Luther" (1846); and Roget's Thesaurus of English Words (1854). Pres. Sears was married 16 Feb 1830 to Elizabeth Griggs, daughter of Deacon Elijah Cory of Brookline, Mass.. They had three sons and one daughter. He died at Saratoga Springs, NY, 6 Jul 1880.

His vessel was captured by a British ship, and he, with one of his men, were made prisoneres and confined on board. From what he heard and saw, he suspected that preparations were making for their summary execution in the morning. He expressed his suspicions to his man, and prepared to escape and swim ashore. His man thought the attempt desparate, but Sears replied: 'I would rather trust my neck in the water than the rope.' About midnight they eluded the sleepy quard, and let themselves down into the water, but were soon discovered, and fired upon from the ship. Sears reached the shore, but his man gave out. He took a boat, went out and picked him up, and both escaped in safety. Nothing daunted by his hairbreadth escape, he went to work immediately to fit out another vessel.

! "After the war he became actively engaged in mechanical and agricultural pursuits.

! He died of apoplexy on Sunday morning, 24 Nov 1816, ae 83. He was greatly beloved, and his funeral was largely attended, his body was born to the grave, on a bier carried by four of his old neighbors.

Then she probably married Samuel Hitchcock about 1766 - had three children (no records of their births anyplace). She died probably about 1771, shortly after her daughter, my 4xgreat-grandmother was born. Then Samuel eventually married her sister, Betsy, and they had one more son. Betsy has a baptismal date in Brewster. NO birth/death/burial/marriage records for Sarah. She is mentioned in the Sears book as marrying a Hitchcock. Betsy is noted as marrying Samuel Hitchcock. Samuel was a Rev. War soldier - no marriage records/death or burial for him even though he died in New Marlborough, Berkshire, MA in 1801, probably in Feb. 



The township is about nine miles in length from north to south, about six miles in width on its southern border, and three on its northern. Its surface is very uneven and hilly, and in some parts mountainous. The soil is hard and rocky, and better adapted to grazing than to cultivation. The Bolton Mountains, or rather a continuation of that range, are situated on the western border of the town. Meshomasic or, in colloquial parlance, Somersic Mountain, one of this range, situated partly in Chatham and part in Glastonbury, is famous for its rattlesnakes with which it has abounded from its discovery to the present day. So numerous were these reptiles at the time of the first settlement that the towns were under the necessity of offering a bounty for their destruction, which was usually "six-pence a tail," to copy the quaint language of the record. The late Dr. CHAPIN, in his "Glastonbury for two hundred years," published in 1853, says that the Indian name of this mountain testifies to the same peculiarity, Me-shom-as sek signifying great rattlesnake. Hammond TRUMBULL, of Hartford, who is considered the best authority on the Indian language in the United States, in a volume published in 1881, entitled, "Indian names of places in and on the borders of Connecticut, with interpretations of some of them," says that there is no foundation for Dr. CHAPIN's interpretation, but that he can suggest nothing better unless it can, by some steep declivity or deep chasm, be identified with Massawomasoq, which denotes a great declivity (literally, down going), and is applicable to a steep ledger, hillside, or high bank, which might easily be found in the vicinity. Of later years these reptiles are not found in any considerable numbers, but occasionally, in a hot, dry season, some have been killed even in the center of near villages. Bald Hill, famous for its rattlesnakes, trailing arbutus, and peculiar kind of quartzite rock much sought after for scythe stones, is situated in the same locality. Great Hill, or Governor's Ring, so called from the supposition that Governor WINTHROP obtained gold enough to make a ring from its rocks, is the southwestern terminus of this range. The famous Cobalt Mines, of which more will be said in another place, were excavated in the side of this mountain. A good view of Long Island Sound can be obtained from its summit on a clear day, and with the aid of a powerful glass, vessels can be seen sailing up and down upon its waters, some thirty miles away. CLARK's Hill, so called from its having been in the possession of families



of that name from the first settlement of East Hampton Parish to the present day, lies to the eastward of Great Hill. A good view of the sound can also be had from this point. Pocotopaug Lake, northeast of the village of East Hampton and near to Marlborough line, is a beautiful sheet of water, nearly nine miles in circumference, following the circuitous windings of its shore. Its Indian name was always supposed by the inhabitants of the town to mean "clear water," as its waters are very clear and transparent; but Mr. TRUMBULL, in the work before mentioned, says that the meaning of the name is obscure, but the interpretation which seems most probable is "divided pond," Pohqutaepauq, the pond having the appearance of being double, composed of two nearly circular ponds, united by a short narrow strait. This pond was in the line of the old bridle path between providence and Middletown, and travelers were taken across this strait on a raft. This bridle path entered the town just north of the present dwelling house of Morris COLBERT, and passing down the hill in a westerly direction ascended the Bear Swamp ledges through what is now known as the Dugway, and, swinging to the northward of Great or BAKER's Hill, so-called, it came out on the shore of the lake, on MARKHAM's Point, where it crossed to what is now called HINKLEY's Point, then turning to the left and northward of the lake crossed the summit of CLARK's Hill, and thence in a westerly direction toward Middletown. The waters of this lake abounded with pickerel, perch, bullheads, roach, and dace for a number of years after the settlement of the town, but the introduction of black bass, a game fish, into its waters a few years since, has had a tendency to diminish the original denizens, both its size and number. There are no inlets, of any size, to Pocotopaug Lake, it being fed probably by low springs, as rains that do not run off the ground do not affect its height materially. There is a beautiful legend connected with this lake, that an Indian maiden sacrificed herself here by direction of the Great Spirit, and the promise to her was that no person should ever be drowned in its bosom. Taking the legend for what it is worth, it is a well established fact that up to the time of writing, no person, so far as known, has ever been drowned there. To the east of this lake rises a bare round hill, known as BAKER's Hill, from a family of that name that live near its summit. On the top of this hill a well was dug some 40 feet in depth for some parties in New York, who were intending to build a summer house here, but for some reason failed to do so. This well is now nearly filled with stones and debris dropped in by visitors to this locality. A good view of Colchester, Westchester, Marlborough, Gilead, and East Haddam can be obtained from this point. A chain of ledges skirts along the eastern side of this hill and runs in a northerly direction into the town of Marlborough. At the foot of these ledges lies Bear Swamp, a locality where bears were plenty at the time of the first settlement of the town, and which is almost impenetrable on account of the thick growth of underbrush that covers its face. Bear Swamp Brook, a continuation of what is known further south as Potash Brook, runs through this swamp in a northerly direction into Marlborough where it loses itself in DICKINSON's Stream. Flat Brook, near the eastern border of the town, flows southerly under the Rapallo Viaduct on the Air Line Railroad, and empties into Salmon River near the Colchester line. Salmon River, the two principal sources of which rise in Hebron and Lebanon, flows through the parish of Westchester and across the southwestern corner of the town, separating the parish of East Hampton from Westchester, and the town of East Haddam from Haddam, and empties into the Connecticut near Mount Tom. On either side of this stream rise abrupt hills covered with groves of hemlock, oak, and chestnut. In Connecticut Land Records, Volume 111, page 85, this river is described as the west bound of Jeremy ADAMS' farm in Colchester, in a grant to him from Uncas, in 1662, and is called the Tatamucuntaway. Pine Brook, the only outlet of Pocotopaug Lake, is recorded in Connecticut Land Records, volume I, page 456, as Niuppaquashneag Brook. This word, evidently corrupted, property represents Wunni-appoquasinne-auke and means good flag place or where flags (Appoquasinash, for making mats, etc.) are plenty (TRUMBULL's Indian Names, page 1). This stream flows in a southwesterly direction, furnishing power for the many thriving industries of East Hampton, and empties into Salmon River a few miles from its mouth. Muddy Gutter Brook and Green River flow through the central part of the town in a southerly direction, and empty into Pine Brook. Cobalt Brook, rising near the Cobalt Mine, flows through the village of Middle Haddam and empties into the Connecticut River near the old ship-yard. TAYLOR's Creek, flowing down from Great Hill Meadow, in the east part of Portland, divides the two towns. Glen Falls, where the water flows over a precipice 30 feet in height, is on this stream. Eastward from the Connecticut River, the ground rises, in some places gradually, and in others precipitously for about a mile, the height bearing the name of Hog Hill from the following circumstance. Soon after the settlement of this locality the hogs belonging to the early settlers were suffered to roam at large, under certain restraints. During a severe storm they took refuge in the basement of the first meeting house in Middle Haddam Parish, which stood near the southern extremity of this hill. This house, standing on a side hill, was stoned up underneath, leaving a vacant place under the church, a small aperture being left in the wall for ingress and egress. Some party or parties closed this aperture and imprisoned these animals, who were not discovered until the following Sabbath, when their grunting disclosed their presence, and they were released from their prison. East of this hill, and about a mile distant from summit to summit, rises another to about the same height, known as Chestnut Hill. Through the valley, between these two hills, Green River flows, uninterrupted to its mouth. South of East Hampton village is MILLER's Hill, so called from an early settler of that name, and to the south and east of this are the ranges known as the SMITH Hills. Mill Brook rises between these two hills, and flows southerly to Salmon River. BEVIN Hill, in the western part of East Hampton village, and MOTT Hill, north of the lake, were so called from early settlers of those names. North of Pocotopaug Lake is a stream known as WELLS' Brook, which flows in a southerly direction, and empties into DICKINSON Stream in Marlborough. All the streams described abounded with delicious brook trout at the time of the early settlement, but in many of them they have long since disappeared, and their number greatly diminished in the others.

Following six months of repairs, she went to the South Atlantic on a similar mission. 

Attached is the document I've beenworking on. It traces the Armstrong family from John Armstrong (1784 - 184?)through his granddaughter, Fanny (Oliver) Sears and then down her line as faras I've been able to go.

I'm currently tracing Fanny's sonEdwin. He seems to have stayed in Illinois with his Sears grandparentsafter his father Edwin (1860) died and his mother Fanny moved back to JerseyCity NJ. Someone has put on Ancestry.com that Edwin married Mary Mills on 20September 1883 in Winnebago IL. I can't confirm this. I do know that by 1879Edwin was living with Fanny in Jersey City. Edwin died in Jersey City on13 July 1889 where he had lived for 9 years according to his death record. Hismarital status at death was "widowed".

I'm unaware of what happened toFanny's daughter Olive and I don't know when Fanny died; it was sometime afterthe 1910 census.
