

# Introduction

The following pages list data for all known family members as of 26<sup>th</sup> September 2020.

Each immediate family is presented in their own section that contains a graphical family tree as well as a description with information about each referenced person and their children. The child section provides information about the children of the preceding couple. When a child has offspring of their own this is presented in a separate family section for that child. In this case a '+' is used to denote that an individual will appear later in the book as a parent with his/her own children and there is a link to the appropriate family reference number. For children with partners but no offspring the partner data is given with the reference family. Roman numerals, followed by a period, are used to indicate the birth order.

In the chapter titled "Family of the Starting Person" the ancestors of Reuben Sears are presented in a kind of enhanced Pedigree Chart which displays the graphic representation of their direct-line ancestors and the children of the couple. This chapter contains information about the couple whose relatives are listed in the later chapters.


The chapter titled "Families of his Ancestors" provides details (as known as of the publication date) for the relatives of Reuben Sears. There is a chapter for each generation. Relatives are listed in the order of the nearness of their relationship.

Sources for the information provided are given in the footnotes.

This document reports the details of 434 individuals, of whom 200 are male and 234 are female. Of the 334 individuals with recorded birth and death dates, the average lifespan was 57.43 years. Of these, 158 males averaged 58.91 years, and 176 females averaged 56.09 years. The longest living male was Charles Hall Sears (1856–1958), who died aged 101. The longest living female was Mary Elizabeth Polly Sears (1863–1969), who died aged 105.

2. At the age of 23, Reuben married **Nancy Sears** on Sunday, 6<sup>th</sup> November 1814, in Harwich when she was 19 years old. They had ten children: Nancy (1815–1867), Elijah (1817–1873), Christopher (1820–1885), Reuben (1822–1899), Willard (1827–1838), Mary (1831–1873), Olive (1834–1898), Heman (1836–1903), Willard (1840–1919) and Pamelia (1842–).

Nancy was born in Dennis on Sunday, 9<sup>th</sup> November 1794.<sup>[1, 2]</sup> She was the daughter of Christopher Sears and Mary Polley Snow.

Nancy reached 77 years of age and died on 2<sup>nd</sup> May 1872.<sup>[1, 2]</sup> She was buried at gr-st in Red Top Cemetery, West Brewster, Brewster.<sup>[1, 2]</sup>

**3. Reuben³ Sears** (*Willard*²) was born on Thursday, 27<sup>th</sup> September 1753, in Harwich, Barnstable, Massachusetts, USA.<sup>[10, 11]</sup> He was the son of Willard Sears (30) and Susannah Howes (31).

Reuben was christened in East Yarmouth on 17<sup>th</sup> February 1765. He died in Brewster on 4<sup>th</sup> November 1844, at the age of 91.<sup>[10, 11]</sup> Reuben was buried in Red Top Cemetery, West Brewster, Brewster.<sup>[10]</sup>

In her 1957 hit "Old Cape Cod," Patti Page extols the virtues of our salty air, but how often do we think about the value salt has had here, and its once vital role in the commercial fishing industry?

From the early days of the Massachusetts Bay Colony salt was critical for ensuring the stability of offshore catches, which in turn drove the economy.

"Plentiful quantities were required to preserve the fish caught by vessels that would go out to the Grand Banks for months at time," says Yarmouth's Bob Kelley, a tenth generation Cape Codder, member of the Dennis Historical Society and vice president of Yarmouth Historical Society. "They would catch the fish, gut them and pack them with salt before throwing them in the hold. An average 40-ton schooner would use 700 bushels of salt a year."

New England's salt supply was originally imported from England and Mediterranean countries, and eventually the British Caribbean Islands, which developed "works" to evaporate seawater and extract the valuable mineral.

"Salt making by solar evaporation really began here in 1775," says Kelley. "The resource of salt water had always been here, but the colonists didn't have the ability to extract it profitably."

The cost of wood fuel needed to boil ocean water to distill salt was the problem.

"It cost more to burn the fires to get the salt than the salt was worth," says Kelley.

It was cheaper to import through England's vast network of colonies, territories and commodity exchanges.

But by 1775, the American colonies and England were on the brink of war, so the British government issued a much-despised salt tax and other interdictions that placed embargoes on imported goods and prohibited colonists from fishing off Nova Scotia.

"That is really what started things off," says Kelley. "The king intended to starve them into submission, so it inspired Capt. John Sears and others to begin this process."

In the Quivet Neck section of what was then Yarmouth (now Dennis), Sears built a 10-foot by 100-foot shallow wooden container, and used buckets to fill it with seawater, which then evaporated in the sun. Solid salt remained, but not much: In 1776, the first full year of production, Sears' salt vat only produced eight bushels of salt.

Sears, who had spent most of his life as a professional sea captain, caulked and improved his salt works and managed to increase production to 30 bushels the following year. Local neighbors were amused by "Sears' Folly," until November of 1778, when Sears salvaged a bilge pump from the wreck of the HMS Somerset III, a British man-o-war that sank off Provincetown (and had figured largely in the ongoing Revolutionary War.)

Sears put the recovered pump to work drawing seawater into the vat. His cousin Reuben Sears, a woodworker who had helped Sears with building the salt works, conceived of a rolling cover for the vat, which protected the seawater from being diluted when it rained.

"It became such an important industry in town," says Kelley, "that when it was about to rain they would let school out so all the children could go to the salt works to help roll out the cover."

When Nathaniel Freeman of Harwich suggested that Sears use a wind-driven pump for raising the water, the business flourished. These "pump mills" allowed cisterns beneath the windmills to capture thousands of gallons of water, which was then dispersed via wooden aqueducts into the vats, at about a foot deep.

Sears obtained a patent for his invention in 1799, which he in turn granted to others, including Nathaniel Freeman, as a thank-you for his wind pump contribution.

"In that way," says Kelley, "Freeman ended up with the rights to salt works in Harwich, Orleans and Chatham."

Sears also deeded a large portion of his salt works in perpetuity to his sister Deborah Sears' husband Christopher Crowell, who was his financier. "Sears gave back to a lot of people who helped him," says Kelley.

By the early 1800s much of the Cape was operating successful salt works, with around 800 vat systems on the peninsula creating salt. And they were doing it year round. Summer was the season to produce common salt, but when the salt water became too cold in winter months, sodium sulphate (known as Glauber salt) would form instead. Cape Cod salt makers would sell their winter Glauber salt for other uses, including soap and dyes for textiles.

Sears' design was not the only schematic for salt production.

"Hattil Killey invented one called 'crane works' which was like a checkerboard," says Kelley, "with two covers connected diagonally with a fulcrum in the center and a metal rod into the ground. I believe it was an improved version, but the Sears model was less expensive to set up."

Other Killeys, including brothers Seth and Zeno, worked with Abiel Akin and Isiah Crowell (himself a nephew of John Sears) to bring salt works to the Bass River area of Yarmouth.

"The works were located around the area where Ship Shops is now and extended above Main Street, half way up to Long Pond." says Kelley. "My great, great grandfather David Kelley was still producing salt in Bass River village from 1885 through 1890. It was a local industry that lasted at least 100 years."

Salt's economic importance to Cape Cod was reflected in the ongoing battles between the northern industrial states and the rural south. The US government responded with varying levels of tariffs and embargoes, see-sawing between benefitting the North or placating the South. There were salt duties, subsidies, and the 1828 "Tariff of Abominations" (so called by the South) which was implemented to protect northern industry by taxing imported goods. By 1846, the pendulum had swung back again and the Walker Tariff reduced the rates of import duties.

"It was really the tariffs and the embargoes that regulated whether you could make a profit or not in producing salt," says Kelley.


While various fluctuations on imports and exports wounded the industry, the discovery of salt deposits in upstate New York and ultimately the invention of refrigeration ended the salt works era on Cape Cod.

You can still relish local salt, but now as a cooking seasoning rather than a wholesale preservative. Businesses such as 1830 Sea Salt, Cape Cod Saltworks and the Wellfleet Sea Salt Company make it possible for you to sprinkle some locally harvested salt onto a nice filet, without needing to pack it into a barrel.



I believe that the confusion arises because there were two Hannah Hopkins in Brewster at the time of Orin's marriage. Let's first consider Hannah Mayo Hopkins (nee Nickerson). The Nickerson Family Genealogy (Part IV, page 400) states that Hannah M. Nickerson married Zoheth Hopkins Junior (intentions 19 Apr 1817 per the Brewster Vital Records) and she perhaps married second Orin Sears. I find no record of a death or divorce of Zoheth. However, I do find the record of the marriage intentions of Miss Hannah M. Hopkins (21 Nov 1829, per the Brewster VR). I find the Miss significant because on the same and adjacent pages of the Brewster VR there are several marriage intentions where the spouse is listed as Mrs, indicating that she was previously married. This is not the case with Orin Sears and Hannah Hopkins. Samuel May's Sears genealogy lists Hannah Hopkins, born in Provincetown, 18 Sep 1808. This date is consistent with the dates for the spouse of Orin Sears in several US censuses, e.g., 1850 and 1880, but it is not consistent with Hannah Mayo Nickerson being the spouse of Orin Sears, as she was married to Zoheth Hopkins, and bore a child in 1817, at the age of nine? As to the second Hannah Hopkins, the Hingham Vital Records record the death of the spouse of Orin Sears on 30 Mar 1891 as being age 82 years, 6 months, and 12 days, which corresponds exactly with the date of birth of 18 Sep 1808 listed above. !This is a beautiful vessel of 770 tons register, with long, sharp ends a buoyant floor, and is designed not only to sail fast, but to stow a large cargo. She is 165 feet long on the keel, 171 feet between perpendiculars on deck, has 34 1/2 feet extreme breadth of beam, and 23 feet depth of hold, including 8 feet height of between decks. She has 13 inches dead rise at half floor, 2 feet sheer, and tapers in aft 4 1/2 feet on each side from her extreme breadth of beam. Her stem is nearly upright, though her head is carried well out and rises up to the bowsprit. It is a neatly carved and gilded billet, and its lower outline is the continuation of the moulding of the planksheer; and the trailboards and navel hoods are blended in one, and are ornamented with carved work. She has a waist of six narrow strakes, defined between the mouldings of the upper wale and the planksheer, and her stern is nearly oval in outline, and ornamented with gilded carved work, in the centre of which are representations of peral shells, and her name and port of hail are also in gilded letters, upon a scroll from each side of the arch. The ground of the stern is black, and her hull above the vellow metal, with which she is sheathed, is of the same color. She has a topgallant forecastle, a large gouse abaft the foremast for her crew, galley, &c., and another house aft for her cabin, built into a half poop deck. The cabin is white, relieved with gilded lines and flowers, and has spacious state rooms on each side, for the accommodation of passengers. The cabin and state rooms are neatly finished and well furnished. The bulwarks, houses, &c., are painted buff color, relieved with white, and the waterways are blue. Her frame, all the hooks, all the stanchions, and all the knees in the hold are of white oak, the knees in the between-decks of hackmatack, and her ceiling. planking and deck frame are of hard pine. The keel is of rock maple, sided 15, and moulded 20 inches, on floor timbers on the keel are 11 by 16, and she has two depths of midship keelsons, each 15 inches square, with a rider over them, and sister keelsons alongside the lower tier, the whole strongly bolted with copper and iron, the copper driven through and rivited. The floor ceiling is 4 inches thick, on the bilge are two strakes of 13 inches, then follow 2 of 9 inches, then 3 of 8 inches, graduated to 7, and then a lap stringer of 10 inches, upon which the lower ends of the hanging knees rest; and the clamps above are 7 1/2 inches thick, all square fastened. She is square bolted throughout. Her between-decks waterways are 15 inches square, with thick work inside and over them, and the ceiling above is 5 inches thick. The upper deck waterways are 12 inches square, and the planksheer and main rail are each 6 inches thick. She has 7 inches garboards, wales of 5 by 7, and waist of 4 inches, all square fastened, and butt and bilge bolted in the usual style. Her lower deck beams are 15 inches square, and those under the upper deck are 9 by 15, and her deck planking is 3 1/2 inches thick. Her ends are strongly secured with hooks and pointers, and her hold stancions are kneed in the wake of the hatchways. In a word, she is very strongly built and well finished. She is seasoned with salt, and has Emerson's patent ventilators and all the other improvements of the day. She is handsomely sparred, and well rigged. Messrs. Blanchard & Caldwell made her spars, and Mr. Joseph J. McClennen rigged her. She was built at Charlestwom,

by Mr. Joseph Magoun, and was modelled by Mr. Elisha Stetson. Capt. Winthrop Sears, who now commands her, superintended her construction and equipment, and he has done his work well. Capt. Sears is well known as an excellent sailor, and every way qualified to make her do her best. She is owned by Messrs. Alpheus Hardy, Joshua Sears, and others, and is now loading with despatch in Tomothy Davis & Co.'s line of California clippers. She is lying at the south side of Long wharf, and will sail for San Francisco in about a week. Call and see her. Messrs.Davis & Co. have also engaged the magnificent new clipper ship King Fisher, Capt. Tully Crosby, to follow the Ocean Pearl. This spendid vessel is nearly 1200 tons register, and is designed expressly for speed. We will endeavor to give a sketch of her soon. Boston Daily Atlas, August 29, 1853.

!Yarmouth Register, 10 Mar 1883, p 1, Capt Winthrop Sears -- departed this life at his home in Yarmouth Port, on Wednesday evening last. He was at the director's meeting at the Bank, on Monday forenoon, and about noon was taken with intense pain, and Dr Pulsifer, and later Dr Marstin of South Yarmouth, were summoned to his assistance. Temporary relief was gained, but the former trouble returned on Tuesday afternoon, and on Wednesday evening he passed quietly away. His disease was neuralgia of the heart, with nervous prostration. Capt Sears was born in West Yarmouth, Jan 2, 1818, and at the age of 18 commenced following the sea. At 21 years of age he was master of the brig Robert Wall, a Philadelphia and Boston packet, and afterwards of the bark Tremont, the Ocean Pearl, and for several years of ship Conquest, in the foreign trade. After this he was in charge of the Benj. Franklin, the pioneer boat of Boston and Philadelphia steamship line, the Wm. Penn, of the same line, and the Concordia and St Louis, of the Boston, New Orleans and Liverpool line. During the war he was in command of a transport in the United States service. His last service at sea, was as commander of steamer Saxon, of the Boston and Philadelphia line. Capt Sears retired from the sea about ten years ago, and also from active business pursuits. He was, however, intimately identified with the affairs of this community, and such was the reliance placed in his judgement and integrity, that his services were often sought in the public transactions and enterprise of the day. He was elected one of the board of Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor for several successive terms, retiring in January of his own accord, and had his life been spared he would have again been called to the same position. He was a Director of the First National Bank, a Trustee of the Woodside Cemetery Association, and connected with other local organizations. Affable in his manners, correct and just in his business relations, he enjoyed a wide popularity among his associates, who will greatly miss him in the various relations of life. Capt Sears was three times married, and leaves a widow and four children to lament the great loss which they, as well as the public, have sustained by this afflictive event.



He removed from Yarmouth to Boston in 1808, and soon engaged in business on Long Wharf, continuing in the same store till the close of his life, and accumulated a large property. He was just in his dealings, painstaking, frugal, temperate, assiduous and far-seeking. He was an original thinker, a great reader, with a tenacious memory, enabling him to repeat much that he had read, even whole pages of the Iliad, (Pope's translation) Articles of noticeable ability were often written by him for the papers, and he would doubtless have stood high in any profession he might have chosen. His married life was brief, but happy. "Man proposes but God disposes," was the exclamation with which he bowed to the severity of bereavement. Carrying his infant in his arms to the baptismal font, he seemed ever after especially solicitous that the education of the child should be religious, and when himself about to depart, his interest in this was deeply marked in the charge to his son's guardians. Mr Sears left legacies to numerous relatives (including each of two Crocker nieces), to the Seaman's Friend Society, and for a nautical school

!NEHGS Register Oct 1873 The Will of Joshua Sears: Know all men by these presents, that I, Joshua Sears, of Yarmouth, in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Merchant, do make and publish this my last will and testament, as follows, to wit:

- -I give to my brother, Charles Sears, of said Yarmouth, twenty-five thousand dollars.
- -I give to my brother, Willard Sears, of New-Bedford, in said Commonwealth, twenty-five thousand dollars.
- -I give, devise and bequeath to my nieces, Hannah Sears and Catherine Sears, daughters of my brother Charles Sears, the house in said Yarmouth now occupied by said Charles Sears, the stable and Register Office, with the land under and around them, being the same premises which said Charles conveyed to me. It being understood that my brother Charles Sears shall with his wife occupy the same during their lives and the life of the survivor of them, they paying the taxes and keeping the premises in repair.
- -I give to my niece, Mary Jane Myrick, two thousand dollars, in full for services rendered and which she shall render to my son, Joshua Montgomery Sears, until he shall be five years old.
- -I give to my nephew, Cyrus A Sears, ten thousand dollars, to be paid to him-five thousand dollars when he shall be twenty-five years old, and five thousand when he shall be thirty-five years old, the interest on said sums, until payment of the principal, to be paid by my executors and trustees to said Cyrus or his guardian.
- -I give to my nephew, Isaac Myrick, fifteen hundred dollars to set him up in business.
- -I give to the other children of Isaac and Lucy Myrick, one thousand dollars to each.
- -I give to my nieces, the children of my sister, Sally Crocker, fifteen hundred dollars to each.
- -I give to the two children of my sister, Hannah Hamblin, one thoudand dollars to each. I order and direct my executors and trustees to pay to my sister, Hannah Hamblin, the income of five thoudand dollars during her life.
- -I give to my executors and trustees five thousand dollars, in trust, to pay the income to my niece, Olivia R Sears, during her life, and after her decease said five thousand dollars to go to her heirs.
- -I give to the town of Yarmouth, my native town, fifteen thousand dollars, for the purpose of founding a school on the north side of Yarmouth, for teaching navigation and kindred sciences. I five to the Boston Seaman's Friend Society three thousand dollars.
- -I nominate and appoint Alpheus Hardy, of Dorchester, in said Commonwealth, merchant, to be the guardian of my son, Joshua Montogomery Sears.
- -I nominate and appoint Alpheus Hardy, of Dorchester, Horatio Harris, of Roxbury, merchants, and Hugh Montgomery, of Boston, counsellor-at-law, all of said Commonwealth, to be the executors of and the trustees under this my will; and it is my will, and I request that my executors shall not be required to give any other or greater bonds to the Judge of Probate than said Judge shall, under all the circumstances of the case, in his discretion think best.
- -All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate I give to said Alpheus Hardy. Horatio Harris and Hugh Montgomery, their heirs and assigns, as joint tenants in trust, to hold, invest and manage, and take care of the same according to their best knowledge and discretion, and I wish them to invest one-half part of said estate in bottom mortgages on estates which shall be considered of twice the value of the money loaned thereon, the title of sch estates to be well examined. I give to my son, Joshua M Sears, the sum of thirty-thousand dollars, to be paid to him at the age of twenty-one years. All such parts of the income of my estate which may be necessary for the support and education of my son, I order to be used for that purpose, and when he shall be twenty-one years old, I direct that four thousand dollars shall be paid to him annually; when he shall be twenty-five years old, six thousand dollars per year, and ten thousand dollars per year when he shall be thirty-five years old. And in case of the death of my son before he arrives to the age of twenty-one years, then I direct that ten thousand dollars be paid to said town of Yarmouth for the purpose of a library, and six thousand dollars for free lectures in said town. And the residue and remainder of said estate I direct to be paid and divided, one-third thereof to my brother Charles, one-third to my brother Willard, and one-third to the children of my brother Thomas W Sears. Witness my hand and seal this 5th day of February, A.D. 1857 "Aid" erased and "Friend" inserted; "Six" erased and "ten" inserted, before signing. In presence of us, who sign as witnesses to this will Joshua Sears [seal] Wm H Howard, Joseph C Pray, Saml B Deane

The Barnstable Patriot remarks upon the will as follows: "Much harsh and unkind remark has been made by thoughtless persons as to some of the provisions and some of the omissions of this will, and we think it just, therefore, to say that the testator fully intended to make many other bequests, and would have done so on the day after this was executed; but his health declined so rapidly that he was unable to do more. It was wise in him and in those who advised him, that he fully executed what was done, making that part of his intention sure, and all will agree that this partial and incomplete will 'is much better than none, and all that

could be obtained under the circumstances,' using the language of one of the executors. The result is simply an admonition to all the men to attend to so important a duty before the last suffering hours of life."

The principles of a concern then did not delegate certain transactions to their clerks as they do now-a-days. Josh was an early bird, sunrise rarely found him under the sheets; if there was a worm to be caught he was sure to catch it. At the time we write of, Boston controlled full three-quarters of the West India trade of the country, and the daily arrival of severl [sic] cargoes of molasses in the season was no unusual occurrance. We have sold our birthright in it since to New York, as we have nearly every thing else that once gave us a commercial pre-eminence, and for something else than a mess of pottage. A cargo of molasses was classified after being landed on the pier, as sour for distilling, and sweet for retail, and after the cargo was landed and guaged by the Custom House official, it was offered by sale. If it was a fair average cargo it was offered to the jobbers, the price being fixed upon the hogsheads as they ran. Josh would often buy several hundred hogsheads, and resell to the smaller jobbers he of course always bought them 'as they run' but not till after he knew exactly how they did run. Now every one knew that Josh Sears was a very shrewd buyer, but how he always managed to get the best retailing molasses out of a cargo, without getting any sour hogsheads, passed the understanding of importers and buyers, till at last a very shrewd importer, whom we will call G---, had his suspicions that the early prowling propensities of Josh meant something besides exercise to get up an appetite. A cargo of molasses having arrived to his consignment, he determined to watch. So taking his position early one morning where he could see unobserved, he waited. Not long after a well known individual was seen approaching, bung driver and broomstick in hand, accompanied by two Irishmen. Said individual proceeded to try the molasses, and upon every hogshead that proved satisfactory he placed a small private mark. When he had selected the quantity he wanted, he ordered the men to toll them into a certain position and then left the wharf before anyone was stirring. As soon as he was out of hearing, G--- jumped from his hiding place, with a laugh "Ah!" said he, "I have it. Josh, old fellow, you are done now." He immediately procured a large gang of men, shifted the hogsheads, replacing them with others, taking the precaution to put the same private chalk mark on, and leaving a few of the original private inspections at the head of each tier for Josh to try. returning to the counting room Josh entered as expected. 'Well, G---, what are you asking for the 'Twenty-eight cents.' 'Fair cargo?' 'Yes.' 'Go and look at it now?' Ellsworth's cargo?' is it landed?' This last question was almost too much for G---'s gravity. 'Bartlett's wharf; well, come along.' Arrived at the wharf Josh cast his eye keenly along the hogsheads: there were big marks. All right, and then he went through the form of trying several hogsheads at the head of each tier. They proved satisfactory. 'Think it will run about like this, G--?' 'I don't know. Ther it is; take it as you find it.' 'Well, I'll take thos six tiers, send up as soon as you can, and take off the gauges,' and Josh putting on his big S in chalk, they both left. Josh, as usual, immediately ordered up the ten hogsheads as a sample. Well deposited on the sidewalk at the back of the store. Invitations were sent out to the jobbers to come and inspect; they came, everything was satisfactory, the balance was sold at a handsome advance, clerk was sent down to deliver, gauges were taken off, book-keeper made out the bills. Josh was sitting down at the old desk, pleasantly calculating the net profits of his dodge, when suddenly his reverie was disturbed by the entrance of Mr. A., with 'Look here, Sears, that molasses you sent me is sour.' 'What?' Enter Mr. B. 'That molasses is not what I bought; it is sour.' 'The devil it is!' Enter Mr. C. loquitur. 'Every hogshead of that confounded molasses is sour.' This was too much; up jumped the irate Josh and put for G---'s counting room. G--- was in. 'Look here, G---,' says Josh, 'that molasses I bought of you has soured mighty

suddenly, or else you have given me what I did not buy. I'd like to have it explained. 'Certainly, Mr. Sears, there is a peculiarity about this'South side' molasses; if it is disturbed by rolling the hogsheads before sunrise, it invariably sours, and I have been thinking that perhaps some--- Josh stopped to hear no more, but jamming his hat fiercely over his right ear, and plunging his hands in his pockets, left without a word.

So much of it is - and it's wonderful to have On pg 2 I had not had the Agreement to sell Mr. Mason's house to the Trustees in 1865. (The Boston Athenaeum has been really unresponsive to me. Maybe I asked the wrong questions, or maybe your name caught their eye..:-) I'm not sure this is the one; maybe they bought it as a "tear down" - they built a lot of properties. I'll check. The story about "Josh" Sears is a favorite of mine too - what a find! I never read about anybody who called him "Josh" before! He certainly made every dollar by his own specific efforts, didn't he - Wow. Bottom of page 3 re Joshua Montgomery Sears being in Southboro in the 1900 Census - this is really okay. He had a home there which they called "Wolf Pen Farm". I have a photo of it. (It is still standing.) I guess the Census person just caught them there in 1900, but "in town" other times. I had not seen that Monty was on the committee re the Anniversary of Yarmouth in 1889; it pleases me to see wherever he maintains a connection there - which he evidently really did. On pg 4 you include that long obituary, which I also have, which mentions that 'the elder Sears built himself a mansion on Beacon St - later the Somerset Club'. I tracked this up one side & down the other. The obituary-writer got his Sears confused, and the Beacon St house was definitely built by David Sears -I like the data you have on pg 5 concerning the catalog of JMS' library given to Yale. He had broad interests, and evidently was widely read. Impressive! (You caught the bit about his Stradivarius .. which he played .. also.) I much appreciated the small note about his being part of a group that sponsored an America Cup contending boat. I stumbled across mention of another sailboat that was built for Sears by the person who built the x (famous Cup winner) - and that boat is still in existence. The entry of Pg 6 that JMS Jr died in an auto accident in 1908 is so good - I have the newspaper articles about this from several sources, and can pretty much draw up the story about that in blood-curdling detail. They include photos of him. I also have a lot more information about JMS Jr - I got so nosy as to obtain his grades from Harvard and Harvard Law! Fascinating - they tell a great tale about him. Part of my article is too that he had a sincere interest in archaeology. He took a considerable break after graduation, went to Greece, and wrote a long article (which I also have) about some dockside "ship sheds" there. The article was published in an academic journal. Very interesting. The kid in some ways was a social flibbertigibbet, but had his specific interests and did seem to actually care about selected things. The other was local politics. Pp 7-10, you have taken the family down more widely than I had been able to. In August I did send a few pages of my material (newspaper articles on wedding, and the auto accident) to Montgomery C. Bradley in Connecticut and offered more, but no word at all came back - neither 'Thanks' nor 'Go away'. Honestly I have so much material that you just probably can't incorporate it all into a genealogy format .. or maybe you can? 1930's in Yarmouth which was mentioned each year in the town report. I don't know Nancy Wilson. How may I get in touch with her? What is the connection between the Dennis Sears and the Yarmouth Sears? I know from a descendant for the Dennis Sears I used to date 9 years ago that they might be related. Thanks Again. Nancy WIlson's notes: Hi, Deborah - This is the portion of my notes that addresses the school for navigation. A few thoughts: At one time I looked up the present value of \$15,000 from 1857 - it?s a great deal of money. The fact that the fund is still worth \$26,733 in this century is pretty impressive. nw Another bequest was that of \$15,000 to establish a school for instruction in navigation in Yarmouth. Was this school ever established? Two answers from Mary Sicchio of the Falmouth Historical ..

- 1. Mary finds that although Sears? Will was "for many years the subject of contentious litigation", there is "no evidence that the nautical school was ever established. Through a series of maneuvers which culminated in approval by the courts of the Commonwealth, this sum was diverted to the support of the playgrounds." She states that the money is ?now carried in Yarmouth Town Reports under "Joshua Sears Playground Reserve Fund." In 2005 the line item in the Town Report for this fund showed a balance of \$26,733.00
- But, 2. In the second history of Yarmouth, "Town of Yarmouth, Massachusetts: A History 1639-1989", on page 75: "In 1905 a follow-up on the Joshua Sears legacy for a nautical school came by letter from Isaiah Bray in Honolulu to E. Lawrence Jenkins of the school committee: " It may be of interest to you to know that the plan matured, and I for one received some of its benefits. A room was arranged in the southeast corner of the second story of the Yarmouth High School building, and all necessary instruments, charts, tables, etc. were provided and the windows put on hinges to swing open. Pans of quicksilver were placed in open windows, and with sextants we used this for an artificial horizon. A good many Cape boys went to sea then, and for a few years at least I know a number of them who used the room and the instruments to learn to get the latitude and longitude." Either way, a rather sad product for a bequest of \$15,000! nw] 2.a.: In the Yarmouth Register December 1905, a reporter undertook a history of the Yarmouth Schools from a review of the minutes of the school board. ?1861 - The records state that it was voted to confer with the Trustees of the Sears fund and arrange for the opening of a nautical school, as provided for in the will of Joshua Sears. Mr. Sears was, or had been rather, a nautical man, and had made a fortune in the shipping business; when he died, he left a fund of several thousand dollars to the town to found a nautical school, and I believe for other school purposes. The records say nothing further about this school, and whether it was started or not I do not know.?

L. Ray Sears has found an article originally published in The Boston Commercial Bulletin in 1866, which gives one example of Sears? legendary shrewdness in trade, by a story of ?Josh? Sears? practice in purchase of newly-arrived molasses. It told how he rose earlier than any others, surreptitiously tested all the newly-arrived cargo as to being sweet or sour, and then purchased only those he had marked as desirable. story, was offered at twenty-eight cents (per hogshead, apparently), it can be inferred that he had to have had many other irons in the fire to have amassed his fortune. In 1851 Sears was one of the founders of the Cape Cod Association. This was a small group of Cape men then living in Boston, who met there to keep their hometown ties, and ?to encourage and promote among all native-born and descendants of Cape Cod, temperance, industry, sincerity, good humor, charity, the social affections and generous sentiments.? The first meeting was held at the American House in Boston - besides Sears, a Crocker, three Thachers, a Hallett, a Nickerson and others. While the original gathering was social and intended to be a chance for displaced Cape Codders to get together, they were businessmen too and immediately drafted a constitution, a schedule of meetings, and a list of membership fees. In 1876 (twenty years after Sears had died), the organization began its program of granting college scholarships to native Cape Cod students, and that program has survived, and thrives to the present day. Sears married Phebe Snow in February 1854. S.P. May wrote ?His married life was brief, but happy.? Massachusetts Vital Records shows that they were married in Brookline, MA on February 18th, 1854. Joshua gave his age as 60 (not accurate; he was 62), and she as 35. His parents were shown as Ebenezer and Hannah, and her father only was listed (Robert Snow). Both were shown as residents of Brookline. An obituary of Joshua Sears a few years later cites Phebe as ?daughter of Deacon Snow, of Brewster, Mass?. There is a B&B in Yarmouth, an imposing Greek Revival house, called ?The Inn at Cape Cod?. Its literature says that ?the original owner of the manor was Joshua Sears, born in Yarmouth and son of Revolutionary War officer, Ebenezer Sears. .. legend has it that Joshua built this home for his lovely wife Phoebe as a wedding present; the structure would later become a noted hotel under the proprietorship of Joshua?s brother Charles Sears.? The listing also. however, dates the home at 1830, which was 24 years before he married Phebe Snow. So far no records have been found showing Joshua Sears as having built or purchased this specific property. Charles Sears did own it at one time, and the property is included in a later inventory of Joshua Sears? estate. Sears? death is reported as taking place in Yarmouth Port - possibly in the Greek Revival house, but of that there is no specific proof. It does not seem to match with Joshua Sears? nature to have built, or owned a weekend residence so distant from his work, but this appears to be the case. One obituary did mention that he had a ?country seat? in Yarmouth Port. As to the early history of the house, we do have this, from an article on the web site of the Yarmouth Area Chamber of Commerce, written by local historian Jack ?Summer Street was at one time THE road to Hyannis. .. Next door .. was the Sears Braginton-Smith: Hotel, the building with the columns. It too has had a checkered career: a private home of a wealthy Cape Codder whose business was in Boston, a hotel and inn, a private home, an ?old folks? home, a bed and breakfast and a boarding house in the winter for those who had no heat in their houses and wanted a hot meal without the trouble of cooking at home. This boarding business was very popular. ..? Although it is quite a distance from Yarmouth to Boston, Mary Sicchio of the Falmouth Historical Society advises me that there was convenient public transportation between Yarmouth and Boston, to wit: ?The following appeared in the Yarmouth Register Jan. 25, 1838: "A stage will leave Sears Hotel, Yarmouth Port, for Boston every day (Sundays excepted) at 11 o'clock A.M. and arrive from Boston every day, (Sunday excepted) at six and a half o'clock P.M. Charles Sears, Enock Crocker. All baggage at the risk of the owner"

Joshua and Phebe?s son Joshua Montgomery Sears was born December 25, 1854 in Yarmouth, Barnstable Co, Massachusetts One week later on January 1, 1855, his mother Phebe Snow Sears died. The Yarmouth newspaper reported on January 5, 1855: ?Died - in this village, 1st inst., Mrs. Phebe C., wife of Joshua Sears, Esq., age 34.? And on the next page: ?Sudden Death. It is with extreme regret that we learn the melancholy intelligence of the decease of the estimable wife of our friend Joshua Sears, Esq. at Yarmouth, on Monday morning - just one week after the birth of their only child. This afflicting dispensation will be severely felt by a large circle of friends, besides the bereaved husband. [Courier]? Massachusetts Vital Records indicates that her cause of death was ?puerperal fever (childbed fever)?, and age at death 34 years. (Either this or the 35 at time of marriage is slightly off.) Just two years later, Joshua Sears died on Saturday, February 7, 1857. Although having been ill for ?some weeks?, he only wrote his Will on Thursday, February 5. One obituary says that he died at ?the residence of his sister-in-law, Mrs. T.W. Sears, in South Boston, at half past 12 o?clock on Saturday morning.? [The 1845 Directory of Boston showed Eliza Sears? [?widow?] residence as ?house 32 Fourth?.] Another obituary states that he died at ?the house of Mr. Hinckley, who married the widow of the late Thomas W. Sears, to whom and to whose family Mr. Sears was very much attached. ??Sears died in 1857, leaving a will by which he devised that his son should have a certain annual income from his estate, then estimated to be worth \$1,500,000... the trustees, Alpheus Hardy, Horatio Harris, and Hugh Montgomery, were instructed to provide for the education of J. Montgomery Sears. He was to be given \$30,000 when he became of age and an annual income of \$4000 until he became 25 years old, the income to be increased to \$8000 when he was 30, and then to be \$10,000 a year.? Another bequest was that of \$15,000 to establish a school for instruction in Was this school ever established? Two answers from Mary Sicchio of the navigation in Yarmouth. Falmouth Historical .. 1. Mary finds that although Sears? Will was ?for many years the subject of contentious litigation?, there is ?no evidence that the nautical school was ever established. Through a series of maneuvers which culminated in approval by the courts of the Commonwealth, this sum was diverted to the support of the playgrounds.? She states that the money is ?now carried in Yarmouth Town Reports under ?Joshua Sears Playground Reserve Fund.? In 2005 the line item in the Town Report for this fund showed a balance of \$26,733.00 But, 2. In the second history of Yarmouth, ?Town of Yarmouth, Massachusetts: A History 1639-1989?, on page 75: ?In 1905 a follow-up on the Joshua Sears legacy for a nautical school came by letter from Isaiah Bray in Honolulu to E. Lawrence Jenkins of the school committee: ?It may be of interest to you to know that the plan matured, and I for one received some of its benefits. A room was arranged in the southeast corner of the second story of the Yarmouth High School building, and all necessary instruments, charts, tables, etc. were provided and the windows put on hinges to swing open. Pans of quicksilver were placed in open windows, and with sextants we used this for an artificial horizon. A good many Cape boys went to sea then, and for a few years at least I know a number of them who used the room and the instruments to learn to get the latitude and longitude.?? Either way, a rather sad product for a bequest of \$15,000! \ 2.a.: In the Yarmouth Register December 1905, a reporter undertook a history of the Yarmouth Schools from a review of the minutes of the school board. ?1861 - The records state that it was voted to confer with the Trustees of the Sears fund and arrange for the opening of a nautical school, as provided for in the will of Joshua Sears. Mr. Sears was, or had been rather. a nautical man, and had made a fortune in the shipping business; when he died, he left a fund of several thousand dollars to the town to found a nautical school, and I believe for other school purposes. The records say nothing further about this school, and whether it was started or not I do not know.? Joshua Sears? death was immediately noted in all the Boston papers, and of course in Yarmouth as well. He always retained a great regard for his native town, and has repeatedly sent money to one of his brothers who resides there, with directions to distribute it for the relief of the poor and needy in the place.? Boston Daily Advertiser, February 9, 1857, pg 2. ? .. He was frugal and simple in his habits, and his strictly personal expenses were remarkably small for one of his means. He was very decided in his likes and dislikes, and not at all backward in expressing them.? (!) Yarmouth Register, February 13, 1857, pg 2. .. He was a man of marked peculiarities (!), was always just and honest in his dealings, was frugal, temperate, painstaking and industrious, farseeing and forereaching. He was a man of decided independence of character, and was a quick judge of the character of others, was somewhat eccentric and not always regardful of his personal appearance. He accumulated a large fortune, which he enjoyed very little himself, except the satisfaction of ownership. Boston Daily Courier, February 9, 1857, pg 1. [Reflecting on some of above details, it is interesting to wonder what was in the mind of spinster Phebe Snow, at the age of 35 (in the 1850s, certainly an age when a single lady would be utterly past the hope of marrying) - agreeing to marry this much older man with the many ?marked peculiarities.? We must





stern is nearly oval in outline, and ornamented with gilded carved work, in the centre of which are representations of peral shells, and her name and port of hail are also in gilded letters, upon a scroll from each side of the arch. The ground of the stern is black, and her hull above the yellow metal, with which she is sheathed, is of the same color. She has a topgallant forecastle, a large gouse abaft the foremast for her crew, galley, &c., and another house aft for her cabin, built into a half poop deck. The cabin is white, relieved with gilded lines and flowers, and has spacious state rooms on each side, for the accommodation of passengers. The cabin and state rooms are neatly finished and well furnished. The bulwarks, houses, &c., are painted buff color, relieved with white, and the waterways are blue. Her frame, all the hooks, all the stanchions, and all the knees in the hold are of white oak, the knees in the between-decks of hackmatack, and her ceiling, planking and deck frame are of hard pine. The keel is of rock maple, sided 15, and moulded 20 inches, on floor timbers on the keel are 11 by 16, and she has two depths of midship keelsons, each 15 inches square, with a rider over them, and sister keelsons alongside the lower tier, the whole strongly bolted with copper and iron, the copper driven through and rivited. The floor ceiling is 4 inches thick, on the bilge are two strakes of 13 inches, then follow 2 of 9 inches, then 3 of 8 inches, graduated to 7, and then a lap stringer of 10 inches, upon which the lower ends of the hanging knees rest; and the clamps above are 7 1/2 inches thick, all square fastened. She is square bolted throughout. Her between-decks waterways are 15 inches square, with thick work inside and over them, and the ceiling above is 5 inches thick. The upper deck waterways are 12 inches square, and the planksheer and main rail are each 6 inches thick. She has 7 inches garboards, wales of 5 by 7, and waist of 4 inches, all square fastened, and butt and bilge bolted in the usual style. Her lower deck beams are 15 inches square, and those under the upper deck are 9 by 15, and her deck planking is 3 1/2 inches thick. Her ends are strongly secured with hooks and pointers, and her hold stancions are kneed in the wake of the hatchways. In a word, she is very strongly built and well finished. She is seasoned with salt, and has Emerson's patent ventilators and all the other improvements of the day. Her lower masts are of single spars, and are 74, 78 and 69 feet long, the for and main topmasts 42, and the mizzen topmast 31, and the other masts in proportion. The yards upon the fore and main masts are alike, the lower yards 67, the topsail yards 56, and the crossjack yard 54, and the mizzen topsail yard 44 feet square, and the others in like proportions. She is handsomely sparred, and well rigged. Messrs. Blanchard & Caldwell made her spars, and Mr. Joseph J. McClennen rigged her. She was built at Charlestwom, by Mr. Joseph Magoun, and was modelled by Mr. Elisha Stetson. Capt. Winthrop Sears, who now commands her, superintended her construction and equipment, and he has done his work well. Capt. Sears is well known as an excellent sailor, and every way qualified to make her do her best. She is owned by Messrs. Alpheus Hardy, Joshua Sears, and others, and is now loading with despatch in Tomothy Davis & Co.'s line of California clippers. She is lying at the south side of Long wharf, and will sail for San Francisco in about a week. Call and see her. Messrs.Davis & Co. have also engaged the magnificent new clipper ship King Fisher, Capt. Tully Crosby, to follow the Ocean Pearl. 
!Yarmouth Register, 10 Mar 1883, p 1, Capt Winthrop Sears -- departed this life at his home in Yarmouth Port, on Wednesday evening last. He was at the director's meeting at the Bank, on Monday forenoon, and about noon was taken with intense pain, and Dr Pulsifer, and later Dr Marstin of South Yarmouth, were summoned to his assistance. Temporary relief was gained, but the former trouble returned on Tuesday afternoon, and on Wednesday evening he passed quietly away. His disease was neuralgia of the heart, with nervous prostration. Capt Sears was born in West Yarmouth, Jan 2, 1818, and at the age of 18 commenced following the sea. At 21 years of age he was master of the brig Robert Wall, a Philadelphia and Boston packet, and afterwards of the bark Tremont, the Ocean Pearl, and for several years of ship Conquest, in the foreign trade. After this he was in charge of the Benj. Franklin, the pioneer boat of Boston and Philadelphia steamship line, the Wm. Penn, of the same line, and the Concordia and St Louis, of the Boston, New Orleans and Liverpool line. During the war he was in command of a transport in the United States service. His last service at sea, was as commander of steamer Saxon, of the Boston and Philadelphia line. Capt Sears retired from the sea

about ten years ago, and also from active business pursuits. He was, however, intimately identified with the affairs of this community, and such was the reliance placed in his judgement and integrity, that his services were often sought in the public transactions and enterprise of the day. He was elected one of the board of Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the Poor for several successive terms, retiring in January of his own accord, and had his life been spared he would have again been called to the same position. He was a Director of the First National Bank, a Trustee of the Woodside Cemetery Association, and connected with other local organizations. Affable in his manners, correct and just in his business relations, he enjoyed a wide popularity among his associates, who will greatly miss him in the various relations of life. Capt Sears was three times married, and leaves a widow and four children to lament the great loss which they, as well as the public, have sustained by this afflictive event.





The business at this wharf was the last active employment in which he engaged. Mr Simpkins was also the founder of two Cape newspapers. In 1825 he



established the Barnstable Journal, which he made a successful and paying concern from the commencement during the three or four years of his management and ownership. In 1836 he established the Yarmouth Register, in connection with John Reed, Ebenezer Bacon, Amos Otis and Edward B Hallet, Mr Simpkins being a joint proprietor, and first publisher and business manager. This relation continued for a year or two. He always took a friendly interest in the success and character of the Register, and the present conductor received his kindly greetings upon the paper's attaining its half centennial age, Nov 15, 1886. Mr Simpkins many years ago became the receiver of the doctrines of the New Church, as expounded by Emanual Swedenborg, and as a member of the society of that school of believers, was an efficient aid in the organizations, both local and for the state at large in promulgating the doctrines of the sect. salt pan and covers. The house in which he lived he built for another man, who was unable to pay for it. The latch on the door bears the date of 1770. He reported at Plymouth for duty during the Revolutionary War "walking the distance, forty miles, in one day, carrying his gun and equipments and a bushel of corn in a sack." He was in Captain Perry's company. He served on the alarm at Bedford and Fal-mouth, September 7, 1778. He was "orthodox" and left the church when Rev. Mr. Simpkins began to preach Unitarianism. He became a Baptist, later a Methodist. He was a very pious man, of good character, and pronounced by one of his brothers"a saint on earth." His death was sudden. His children were:

He was foreman for the firm of Johnson, Brown & Company, until the financial panic of 1897, when the firm failed like a large percentage of the manufacturers of the vicinity. Mr. Sears found a place in Boston in a rubber goods store, where he remained some two years, until he entered the service, when he returned to Millbury, which had always been his home. His first enlistment was in the Tenth unattached company of infantry for ninety days as sergeant. He enlisted in 1863 in Company F, First Battallion, Heavy Artillery, and remained in the service for one year, as quartermaster's sergeant. In August, 1865, upon his discharge from the army, he returned to Millbury and opened a drug store. He conducted this business successfully until he became postmaster of Millbury in 1898. He sold his store to Mr. Appel in 1900, who still owns it. Mr. Sears is still serving as postmaster. Mr. Sears is a leader in the Republican Party. He represented the town of Mill-bury in the legislature in 1890. He has a wide acquaintance in the Masonic Order, having taken all the degrees including the 32nd. He has been on the cemetery committee of the town of Millbury thirty-four years and town treasurer for two years. He is chairman of the parish committee of the Unitarian Church. No man in Millburry is better known by his townsmen, and no one is respected more, liked more, honored more and His first wife was Anna E. Moore, daughter of Dr. William B. and Sarah Moore, of Millbury. She was born in Millbury, September 3, 1836, died 1860. He m. (2)at Petersham, Mass., May 28, 1868, Luthera B. Wright, dau. of Deacon Wright. She was born at Deerfield, Mass., Jan 12, 1839; died 1888. The children by his first wife were: 1. an infant. 2. Nathan Walter Sears. Children by his 2nd wife were: 3. Anna Moore Sears b. at Millbury July 27, 1875; educated at the high school at Millbury and State Normal at Worcester, and now teaches in the public schools at Brahamville, Millbury and lives at home. He was formerly energetic in establishing the common schools on their present good basis, and is a leading spirit in all good works of the present day. In accordance with his broad and liberal views, he has educated his own children for usefulness, fitting the daughters for teachers of music and public schools, and the sons for thorough business men. While all are well settled, the second son, Stillman F., has attained to the greatest business success, having made a large property in the firm of I.O. Whiting & Co., the largest importers of grocery molasses in this country. His residence at Cambridge is one of the finest in the suburbs of Boston.

He married the girl next door - Olive Kelley, the daughter of Stillman Kelley who lived in the white house on Sea St just before Cole Pond Rd. In the 1850's Jacob and Olive added the three storeys to their house on Sea St opposite Pleasant St. The large south parlor is the full width of the addition and was used by Sears for many social events, as they enjoyed entertaining. Unfortunately, he died at the age of 47 years. His will was filed for probate on 12 Sep 1871: "After the said Olive F Sears is no longer my widow, either by death or otherwise, I give and bequeath all that may remain of my property for the benefit of the inhabitants of E Dennis and vicinity for educational purposes. Henry H. Sears, C. Walter Hall and Prince M. Crowell, of the town of Dennis,

and their successors, are hereby made a corporation under the name of The Jacob Sears Memorial Library, for the purpose of maintaining in that part of the town of Dennis known as Quivet Neck, the library and other charities of which they are trustees under the will of Jacob Sears, late of Dennis, and under a decree of the supreme judicial court establishing the said will and trust. The said corporation shall have all the powers and privileges and be subject to all the duties, restrictions and liabilities contained in all general laws now or hereafter in force relating to like corporations.

SECTION 2. Any vacancy arising among the said incorporators, who shall be called trustees, or their successors, shall be filled by appointment of the judge of probate and

insolvency for the county of Barnstable. The said judge may also, after notice and a public hearing, remove any of said trustees or their successors for cause shown, and may fill the vacancy so caused in the manner aforesaid. SECTION 3. The real estate and all other property now held by the said trustees shall become the property of the corporation hereby created. The income of the said property shall be expended as follows: --First, for the expenses of said trust. Second, for establishing and maintaining a library. Third, for the instruction of classes in music, or in such other branches of study as are not taught in the public schools in said Dennis. Fourth, for courses of lectures to be given from time to time in the hall of said library. The said classes of instruction and lectures shall be for the free use and benefit of the inhabitants of Dennis, under such reasonable regulations as from time to time may be made by the trustees. SECTION 4. The inhabitants of said Quivet Neck, including as such all persons of and above the age of twenty-one years, male and female, who have resided in that part of Dennis known as Quivet Neck for the period of one year before the time of holding of the meetings hereinafter provided for, may elect by ballot annually a committee of five, who shall not be any of said trustees or their successors, and who shall be such inhabitants of Ouivet Neck, the duties of which committee shall be to advise with the trustees as to the administration of the said trust. Such meetings of the inhabitants shall be held annually upon Quivet Neck in the month of May, at such time and place as shall be determined by the trustees, and may be adjourned from time to time by vote of the voters present thereat. The meetings shall be notified by the trustees by notice posted in more than one public place upon said Quivet Neck, including the outer door of said library building, at least seven days before the time of holding the meeting. The trustees shall determine the right to vote of any person claiming that right in said meeting; and one of the trustees, selected by themselves, shall preside at all such meetings. Said meetings shall be further organized by the election of a clerk, who shall be sworn, and whose duty it shall be to keep and preserve a record of the proceedings of the meetings. The trustees shall submit to said meetings a detailed report of their receipts and expenditures for the year next preceding. The advisory committee of five so chosen by said annual meetings shall advise with the trustees concerning the administration of the trust. They may fix the proportion of the income of the trust which shall be expended respectively for the second, third and fourth objects hereinbefore named; they may select the books to be purchased for said library; and may determine upon the courses of instruction and of lectures which hsall be given in said hall. They shall audit the accounts of the trustees, which accounts shall be kept in due form, and shall be open at all times to the inspection of the committee, or of any member thereof. They shall determine from time to time the compensation, if any, which the trustees shall receive for their services. But the trustees shall have the right to have the settlement of their accounts and the amount of their compensation determined by the court, in case they are dissatisfied with the action of said committee. The acts of a majority of the trustees shall be the acts of the trustees; and the acts of a majority of the said committee shall be the acts of the committee. SECTION 5. Said corporation shall have authority to receive, hold and apply to the uses of the corporation any other property, real or personal, which may be given or bequeathed to it, and to use the same for the objects herein set forth, subject to any restrictions, not inconsistent with this act, which are imposed by the donor or testator. SECTION 6. The said corporation shall have power to do all acts necessary or proper to carry out the provisions of this act. SECTION 7. The town of Dennis is hereby authorized to convey to the said corporation

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect upon its passage [Approved March 20, 1908.]

all its right, title and interest in the free public library on condition that it shall be

maintained free to all the people of the town.

"Tussle with a Burglar. He enters a south end residence, but is pitched headlong from a window.

"Mr David B Sears, who lives at 58 Chester square, had a lively tussle with a burglar early Friday morning, and succeeded in throwing him from the chamber window.

The robber fell heavily to the brick yard below, breaking his leg and stunning him. He was carried off by two confederates who were waiting for him, and all three are still at large.

Mr Sears and his wife occupy a room on the first floor, facing Northampton street. He is usually a heavy sleeper, but Friday morning he awoke suddenly and saw a man creeping stealthily through the window. He had climbed up from the yard by means of a trellis, and was crawling noiselessly into the room when Mr Sears saw him. The latter sprang from his bed, and the burglar arose to defend himself. Mr Sears struck out with both fists, and planted them squarely in the burglar's face. The force of the blow was sufficient to knock him headlong through the open window.

There was a dull thud, and when Mr Sears looked out he saw the fellow lying where he fell, groaning as if in great pain. At that moment two confederates looked through the gate, but dodged back when they saw Mr Sears. But a moment later, having assured themselves probably that he had no fire-arms, they rushed in to where their wounded pal lay and dragged him out of the yard. This was at 2:30 o'clock. Mr Sears called for the police, but as no officer came round he went to bed again.

An hour later later an officer saw tracks where some one had been dragged through the street, and following them found a man lying on the sidewalk on Camden street, and asked him what he was doing there. He replied that he had been on a spree, and had fallen and broken his leg. The officer felt of the limb and assured himself that it was really broken. His charitable instinct led him to go for an ambulance. Neighbors who had been watching this little episode say that the officer had been gone but a few minutes, when two men drove up hastily with a horse and buggy, and lifting the helpless man into the carriage, drove off at a furious gate. When the officer came back with the ambulance, he hunted in vain for the unfortunate individual whose leg was broken.

The burglars were afterwards arrested, and are now serving terms in State's prison.
